*By His Excellency JOHN HUTT,
Esq., Governor and Commander-in-
Chief of the Territory of Western
Australia and its Dependencies,
and Vice-Admiral of the same.*

In pursuance of the authority in me vested by a certain Act of the Imperial Parliament of Great Britain and Ireland, passed in the fifth and sixth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for regulating the Sale of Waste Lands belonging to the Crown in the Australian Colonies," I do hereby notify and proclaim that the following portion of land in the District of the Canning be offered for sale by public

auction at the office of the Collector of Revenue in Perth on Wednesday, the 15th day of (May next, at the upset price affixed thereto, on the terms and conditions set forth in certain Land Regulations dated the 14th June, 1843:—

Country Grant.

Canning location No. 22—comprising 420 acres or thereabouts on left bank of Woongan River, and extending 32 chains 21 links west, 57 chains 15 links south, and 80 chains 4 links east from the south corner of John Adam's Canning location No. 31.—Upset price 20s. per acre.
