## P r o c l a m a t i o n .

*By His Excellency JOHN HUTT,  
Esq., Governor and Commander-in-  
Chief of the Territory of Western  
Australia, and its Dependencies,  
and Vice-Admiral of the same.*

Whereas it hath become expedient for public purposes to resume to the Crown the land hereinafter described, now, therefore, I, the Governor, in pursuance and by virtue of the power in me vested, have resumed, and do hereby resume, for works of public utility and convenience, all that piece or parcel of land situate and being in the District of Sussex, in the said Colony, containing three and a half acres or thereabouts, marked and distinguished in the maps and books of the Surveyor-General's Office as "Sussex Location No. 17," and taken out of location No. 2, and bounded on the West by about twelve chains, fifty-seven links, of the east boundary of Sussex location No. 1, commencing at Southern shore of Vasse Inlet, and extending due south or thereabouts through a post two feet high in a trench in the ground forty-five links south from said shore, to another post two and a half feet high in the angle of a cross trench; bounded on the south by a due easterly line about five chains to a post three and a half feet high in the angle of a trench; on the east by a due northerly line

about six chains in length to a post three feet high in the angle of a trench; then by a due westerly line about four chains, twenty-four links, to a post three feet high in the angle of a trench; and by a due northerly line to Vasse Inlet, passing through a post two and a half feet high placed in a trench at twenty links south from southern shore of said Inlet; and on the north by the said southern shore between the north ends of the east and west boundaries.
