Walter Padbury, for supplying 800lbs of salt pork for the use of the establishment on Rottnest; and

Samuel Moore, for supplying for the use of the same establishment 800 lbs. of salt beef. The beef and pork the produce of the Colony.

His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to direct the publication of the following information in respect to foreign or ship Mails made up in this Colony, either direct for India, or to be forwarded thence by steamer to the United Kingdom.

1st. Letters for persons residing in India, and sent in mails direct to Bombay, are subject to the following rates of postage in addition to the Colonial postage—

Letters not exceeding 3 toles in s. d.

weight, or 1 oz. 2 dwts. and 12 grains.....	4
And an additional 1½d. for every additional tola, or 7 dwts. and 12 grains.	
Newspapers not exceeding 6 tolas or 2½ oz.	1½
And 1½d. for every additional tola, or 7 dwts. and 12 grs.	
Letters for persons in India made up to go via Calcutta or Madras, are liable to the following inland postage in India in addition to the ship postage from this Colony—	
<i>Via Calcutta.</i>	
Not exceeding ½ tola, or 1 dwt. and 21 grs.	10
Not exceeding 1 tola, or 7 dwts. and 12 grs.	1 5
Not exceeding 1½ tola, or 9 dwts. and 9 grs.	2 7½
And 10½d. for every additional ½ tola, 2 dwts. and 18 grs. weight.	
<i>Via Madras.</i>	
Not exceeding ½ tola, or 1 dwt. and 21 grs.	7½
Not exceeding 1 tola, or 7 dwts. and 12 grs.	1 3
Not exceeding 1½ tola, or 9 dwts. and 9 grs.	1 10½
And 7½d. to be added for every additional ½ tola weight.	
Letters, newspapers, or parcels thus sent for persons in India need not have the Indian postage prepaid upon them.	
2nd. Letters for persons residing in the United Kingdom addressed via Southampton are subject to the following rates of steam postage in addition to ship postage from this Colony and the Indian postage as given above, when chargeable—

Not exceeding ½ an ounce.....	1 0
Above ½ ounce and not exceeding 1 ounce.....	2 0
Above 1 ounce and not exceeding 2 ounces.....	4 6
Above 2 ounces and not exceeding 3 ounces.....	6 0
Above 3 ounces and not exceeding 4 ounces.....	8 0
And 2s. for every additional ounce weight or any portion thereof.	
The pre-payment of the steam postage in the Colony is optional, but the rates of Indian postage specified in the foregoing tables which such letters may be subject to must be pre-paid in the Colony.	
The steam postage on letters intended to be forwarded via Marseilles cannot be paid in the Colony. These letters are, however, subject to the same rates of postage.	
3rd. It will be seen from the above statement that a letter not exceeding in weight half an ounce, intended to be sent to the United Kingdom, marked "via Southampton," and which is to be forwarded from the Colony direct to Bombay, will, besides the Colonial postage, be subject to the following rates—	
Ship postage to Bombay.....	s. d. 4½
Steam postage to the United Kingdom.....	1 0

And 10½d. in addition if sent to Bombay by Calcutta; and 7½ in addition if sent to Bombay by Madras.
