His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to direct it to be notified, that the provisional appointment of Mr. T. N. Yule to the office of Protector of Natives during the absence on leave of Mr. Bland, has been approved by the Right Honorable the Secretary of State.

His Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified that "A Bill to repeal the duties on certain goods imported into Western Australia and to impose other duties in lieu thereof" was passed into a law on Thursday, the 25th of last month, but that instructions have been given to the Collector and Sub-Collectors of Revenue to receive the rate of duties chargeable under the former Act upon any goods now in bond, and which may be taken out on or before the 25th day of the present month of August.

The following is the scale of duties chargeable under this Act:—

- On each and every gallon of wine the produce of any part of the British Empire, six-pence.
- On each and every gallon the produce of any other place, one shilling and six pence.
- On each and every gallon of ale or beer of every sort, six pence.
- On each and every gallon of Pickles (including vinegar), and of preserved fruits one shilling.
- On each and every gallon of vinegar, six pence.
- On each and every pound weight of salted or cured provisions, one penny.
- On each and every pound of butter, one penny.
- On each and every pound weight of damaged tobacco or tobacco to be used solely for the purpose of sheep washing, three pence.
- On each and every pound weight of other tobacco, one shilling and six pence.
- On each and every pound weight of cigars five shillings.
- On each and every pound weight of snuff, five shillings.
- On each and every bushel of oats and other grain (including bran) and being food for man, six pence.
- On all live stock not being direct from the United Kingdom, ten pounds for every hundred pounds according to their value.

On all goods, wares, and merchandize imported into this colony, and not already or otherwise subject to a specific duty, a duty of five pounds for every hundred pounds according to their value.
