Proclamation.

By His Excellency JOHN HUTT, Esq., Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same.

In pursuance of the authority in me vested by a certain Act of the Imperial Parliament of Great Britain and Ireland, passed in the fifth and sixth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "an Act for regulating the Sale of Waste Lands belonging to the Crown in the Australian Colonies," I do hereby notify and proclaim that the following allotment of land in the District of the Avon be offered for sale by public auction, at York, by the Resident Magistrate, on Wednesday, the 15th day of January next, at the upset price affixed thereto, on the terms and conditions set forth in certain Land regulations dated the 14th June, 1843:—
