Proclamation.

By His Excellency JOHN HUTT, Esq., Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same.

Whereas it has been deemed expedient to modify the scale of Tolls established by Proclamation dated the 18th October last, as payable at Mahogany Creek; Now, therefore, I, the Governor, do hereby establish the following tolls and charges in lieu of those contained in the aforesaid Proclamation:—

For each head of neat cattle	3d.
For each horse, ass, or mule	3
For each score of sheep, lambs, pigs, or goats	3
For each gig, chaise, cart, dray, or other vehicle, drawn by one horse, ass, mule, or by one pair of oxen	6
For every additional horse, ass, or mule, or every additional pair of oxen	6
