Proclamation.

By His Excellency JOHN HUTT, Esq.
Governor and Commander-in-Chief
of the Territory of Western Australia
and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral
of the same.

In pursuance of the authority in me
vested by a certain Act of the Imperial
Parliament of Great Britain and Ireland,
passed in the fourth and fifth years of Her
Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for
"regulating the Sale of Waste Lands
"belonging to the Crown in the Australian
"Colonies," I do hereby notify and pro-
claim that the following portions of land in
the District of the Swan be offered for sale
by public auction, by the Collector of
Revenue, in Perth, on Wednesday, the
3rd day of September next, at the upset
price affixed thereto, on the terms and con-
ditions set forth in certain land regulations
dated the 14th June, 1843:—

east side of location No. 108, and
in form of a square, with frontage on
left bank of Lennard's Brook, and the
other boundaries lying true north and
south, and true east and west.
