By His Excellency, ANDREW CLARKE, Esquire, K.H. Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof.

No. LX.

An Ordinance for the Remission of Duties on Wines for the consumption of Regimental Officers serving in Western Australia.

Whereas certain duties are imposed by law upon all Wines imported into this colony, and it is expedient to relieve Regimental Officers of Her Majesty's Troops from the payment of such duties in certain cases:

Be it therefore enacted, by His Excellency, the Governor of Western Australia, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, That from and after the passing of this Ordinance, it shall be lawful for the Governor, upon proof to his Excellency's satisfaction that any Wines are imported into this colony or purchased in bond, by or on behalf of any Regimental Officers of her Majesty's Troops serving in Western Australia, to remit or return, subject to such regulations as his Excellency may from time to time appoint, the duties payable or paid on such Wines by any law in force within the colony: Provided that such Wines be for the actual consumption of the said Officers, whether living in mess or otherwise, and provided also that the quantity of Wine upon which a remission of duty shall be allowed, do not exceed upon the whole the quantity of one pint per diem for each Officer.

By His Excellency ANDREW CLARKE, Esquire, K.H. Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same.

TO all whom these Presents shall come, I, ANDREW CLARKE, Esquire, K.H., Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia, and Vice-Admiral of the same, send Greeting: Whereas, at the General Quarter Sessions of the Peace, holden at Perth, in the said Colony, on the seventh day of January, 1846, John Dearden, late a sergeant in Her Majesty's 51st Regiment, was tried and convicted of forging and uttering knowing to be forged a certain order for the payment of money, commonly called a check and thereupon sentenced to be transported for seven years: And whereas, a Petition has been presented to me in favor of the said John Dearden. NOW know ye, that by virtue and in exercise of a power and authority for that purpose in me vested, and in consideration as well of the said Petition as also for divers other causes me thereunto moving, I have extended to the said John Dearden the benefit of Her Most Gracious Majesty's Royal Prerogative of Mercy, hereby granting to him a Pardon, on condition that he shall be confined in Her Majesty's Jail at Fremantle, for the term of five years, to be computed from the said seventh day of January, 1846, and that during such term and confinement the said John Dearden shall be kept to hard labour.
