By His Excellency, Andrew Clarke, Esq. K.H. Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies and Vice-Admiral of the same.

In pursuance of the authority in me vested by a certain Act of the Imperial Parliament of Great Britain and Ireland, and passed in the fifth and sixth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for regulating the sale of Waste Lands belonging to the Crown in the Australian Colonies," I do hereby notify and proclaim, that the following portion of land in the district of Wellington, will be offered for sale by Public Auction by the Sub Collector of Revenue, at Bunbury, on Wednesday, the 25th day of November, at the upset price affixed thereto, on the terms and conditions set forth in certain land regulations, dated the 14th June, 1843.
