In pursuance of the authority in me vested, by a certain act of the Imperial Parliament of Great Britain and Ireland, and passed in the fourth and fifth year of her Majesty's reign, intituled, "an act for regulsting the sale of waste lands belonging to the Crown in the Australian colonies," I do hereby notify and proclaim, that the following portion of land, in the district of Perthshire, will be offered for sale by Public Auction, by the Collector of Revenue at Perth, on Wednesday the 13th day of January, 1847, at the upset price affixed thereto, on the terms and conditions set forth in certain land regulations dated the 14th June, 1843.

Canning Location, No. 23, comprising 160 acres more or less, in form of a square, each side of which measures 40 chains parallel or perpendicular to the S.E. boundary of Canning location No. 31, the W. corner of the section to be at a post piled up with stones on said S.E. boundary at about 157½ chains N.E. from its S.W. end.

the 4th and 5th Vict., of the following description of a Public Road between the East end of the Causeway at the Perth Plains and Fremantle, which has been adopted by the Road Trustees.

The Road to be 1 chain or 66ft. in width on the S.E. side of the following lines, which are described with reference to the true meridian, and are marked at their respective angles by good stout posts 3 to 5 feet out of the ground.

Commencing at E. end of Causeway, the road to run 5 chains 81 links in direction S. 55 degrees E. to the turning off towards Guildford, then 7 chains 90 links S. 5 degrees E. to the turning off towards Point Belcher, then 236 chains 55 links S.W. by S., 29 chains 10 links S.W., and 11 chains 40 links S.W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. to the Narrows in the Canning River, nearly a mile above Point Heathcote.

Crossing the Narrows by a Bridge or Ferry, the road to run 141 chains 53 links S. 60 $\frac{1}{2}$ degrees W. to the S.E. shore of Melville Water, then to skirt the said shore nearly half a mile to the entrance of Alfred Cove, and then to extend nearly 258 chains W.S.W., and 15 chains 19 links to that part of the N. boundary of Fremantle townsite situate 3 chains 17 links E. from the S.E. corner of Mr. E.W. Lamb's 100 acre location No. 71, entering the above townsite at this spot, the new road to extend for the present about 28 chains farther in a S.W. direction to the Canning Road, which enters the located part of the townsite at the upper end of High Street.

His Excellency the Governor, has been pleased to direct the publication, in conformity with the 3rd section of the Act of Council No. 17 of the 4 and 5 Vict., of the following description of a Public Road between Western boundary of Perth townsite and Fremantle, by way of Preston Point Ferry, which has been adopted by the Road Trustees.

Road to be 1 chain or 66ft. wide, on Western side of the following lines, which are described with reference to the true meridian, and are marked at their respective angles by good stout posts, 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ to 4 feet out of the ground.

Commencing at a post on that part of the N.W. boundary of Perth townsite situate 4 chains 53 links N.E. from the said townsite N.W. angle, the E. side of the road extends S. 60 degrees W. 115 chains 2 links, then S. 50 degrees W. 107 chains 30 links, then S. 60 degrees W. 38 $\frac{1}{2}$ chains, then S. 40 degrees W. 4 chains 72 links, then S. 20 degrees W. 37 chains 48 links, then S. 8 degrees W. 20 chains 72 links,

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then S. 20 degrees W. $19\frac{1}{2}$ chains past the Halfway House, on Swan location No. 64, then S. 7 degrees W. 46 chains 28 links, then S. 10 degrees E. 24 chains 48 links, then S. 30 degrees E. 12 chains 20 links, then S. 40 degrees E. 11 chains 73 links, then S. 26 degrees E. 29 chains 21 links, and S. 27 degrees 40 minutes W. 8 chains 93 links to a post piled round with stones at N. side of the Ferry between Points Roe and Preston.

After crossing the Ferry, the E. side of the road recommences at a squared and pointed post at or near the water's edge on E. side of the present Ferry jetty, and extends thence S. 51 degrees W. 25 chains 46 links, then S. $16\frac{1}{2}$ degrees W. 4 chains 37 links to a squared post near S.W. corner of Swan location No. 66, then S. $4\frac{1}{2}$ degrees E. 7 chains 37 links along W. boundary of Fremantle Suburban lot E. to a post at its S.W. corner, then S. $27\frac{1}{2}$ degrees W. 8 chains 39 links, then S. 6 degrees 40 min. W. 7 chains 74 links, and S. $22\frac{1}{2}$ degrees W. 7 chains 78 links to a post near N.W. corner of Swan location No. 65, then S. 16 deg. 50 min. W. 10 chains 32 links to a post near N.W. corner of Swan location No. 64, then S. 16 deg. 35 min. W. 10 chains 55 links to a post at N.W. corner of Swan location No. 63, then S. $32\frac{1}{2}$ deg. W. 10 chains 55 links to a post near N.E. corner of Swan location No. 62, and finally S. $66\frac{1}{2}$ degrees W. 10 chains 2 links to the N.E. boundary of Fremantle townsite, on the W. boundary of location 62 aforesaid.
