tern Australia and its Dependencies,
and Vice-Admiral of the same.*

ted, by a certain act of the Imperial Par-
liament of Great Britain and Ireland, and
passed in the fourth and fifth year of her
Majesty's reign, intituled 'an act for regu-

lating the sale of waste lands belonging to
the Crown in the Australian colonies, I do
hereby notify and proclaim, that the fol-
lowing portion of Land, in the district of
Perthshire, will be offered for sale by

to direct the publication for general infor-
mation of the following Notice given by the
Commander of H.M.S. *Bramble*, of the
existence of a Coral rock in mid-channel of
Endeavour Strait.

H.M.S. *Bramble*, Booby Island,
June 12, 1846.

Notwithstanding the very minute man-
ner in which Endeavour Strait was sounded
when surveyed by me in 1844, I have since
heard of a shoal patch having been discov-
ered by Mr M'Kenzie, master of the late
schooner *Heroine*, nearly in mid-channel.
In consequence of his representation, I
searched for it yesterday, and find a small
coral rock does exist in the position men-
tioned by Mr M'Kenzie. This rock, al-
though surrounded by 8 & 9 fathoms, has
only 3 feet on it at low water; I have na-
med it M'Kenzie Shoal. From it—

- Peaked Hill bears (mag.) N. 62° E.,
dist. 7½ miles
- S.W. Possession Island, (little woody)
N. 18. E., 3½ miles
- N.E. Peak on Entrance Island, N. 23
W., 3½ miles

Cape Cornwall, S. 84. W., 8½ miles
Barn Island, S. 2. E. 4½

As it is most important this danger should be made known as speedily as possible, I beg to request that the above notice may be published by any person into whose hands it may fall.]
