By His Excellency, FREDERICK CHIDLEY IRWIN, Esquire, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, and Vice Admiral of the same,

In pursuance of the authority in me vested, by a certain act of the Imperial Parliament of Great Britain and Ireland, and passed in the fifth and sixth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled 'an act for regulating the sale of waste lands belonging to the Crown in the Australian colonies,' I do

ROCKINGHAM.

His Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified for general information that the survey of the Townsite of Rockingham

having now been completed, it is intended to throw open a portion of the Allotments to the Public, for occupation or purchase, at the following low rates during the present year; That is to say—Allotments on the beach comprising 5 acres, suitable for the purposes of Timber Yards or any similar objects, to be leased annually for £5.
