P r o c l a m a t i o n .

By His Excellency, FREDERICK CHIDLEY IRWIN, ESQUIRE, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, and Vice Admiral of the same,

WHEREAS by the First Section of an Ordinance to provide for the establishment of proper places for the burial of the Dead, passed the twelfth day of August, 1847, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council from time to time, to appoint by Proclamation such place or places in each District as shall be deemed expedient to be reserved for the Burial of the Dead: NOW therefore, I the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this, my Proclamation, appoint the undermentioned places as Reserves for Public Cemeteries in the following Towns respectively, but subject always to such regulations as may be published from time to time for the proper management of the same—that is to say:

By His Excellency Lieutenant Colonel FREDERICK CHIDLEY IRWIN, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Territory of Western Australia, and Vice-Admiral of the same; with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof.

NO. III.

An Ordinance for applying certain sums arising from the Revenue receivable in the Colony of Western Australia, to the service thereof for the financial year commencing 1st of April, 1847; and for the further appropriating the said Revenue.

Whereas power and authority have been vested in the Governor of Western Australia, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, to make, ordain, and establish all such laws and Ordinances as may be necessary for the peace, order, and good government of the same: Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, that out of the produce of the Revenue of the said colony, there shall and may be issued and applied, any sum or sums of money not exceeding Thirty six pounds, five shillings, and one penny for defraying the supplementary charge for the service of the year

ending on the 31st day of March, One thousand, eight hundred and forty six.

II. And be it enacted that out of the Revenue of the said Colony, there shall and may be issued and applied any sum or sums not exceeding Nine thousand two hundred and twenty one pounds, eighteen shillings and two pence, for defraying the expenses of those establishments chargeable on the Colonial fund for the year commencing first of April, One thousand eight hundred and forty seven: that is to say

For the expenditure of the Audit Office, any sum or sums not exceeding £275.

For the expenditure of the Colonial Secretary's Office, any sum or sums not exceeding £125.

For the expenditure of the Colonial Treasurer's Office, any sum or sums not exceeding £59 12s. 6d.

For the expenditure of the Customs and Revenue Department, any sum or sums not exceeding £825.

For the expenditure of the Council Office, any sum or sums not exceeding £150.

For the expenditure of the Ecclesiastical Department, any sum or sums not exceeding £400.

For the expenditure of the Governor's Office, any sum or sums not exceeding £100.

For the expenditure of the Harbor Master's Department, any sum or sums not exceeding £335.

For the expenditure of the Judicial Department, any sum or sums not exceeding £1,200.

For the expenditure of the Medical Department, any sum or sums not exceeding £346.

For the expenditure on account of Natives and Schools for Natives, any sum or sums not exceeding £265.

For the expenditure on account of the Police Force, any sum or sums not exceeding £476 12s. 6d.

For the expenditure of the Post Office Department, any sum or sums not exceeding £616.

For the expenditure on account of Public Works, any sum or sums not exceeding £560.

For the expenditure of the Registrar of Births, Deaths, and Marriage's Office, any sum or sums not exceeding £20.

For the expenditure of the Registrar of Deeds' Office, any sum or sums not exceeding £100.

For the expenditure on account of Roads and Bridges any sum or sums not exceeding £670.

For the expenditure on account of the Rottnest Establishment, any sum or sums not exceeding £466 15s.

For the expenditure on account of Schools any sum or sums not exceeding £200.

For the expenditure of the Survey Department, any sum or sums not exceeding £700.

For the expenditure on account of Miscellaneous Services, any sum or sums not exceeding £1,331 18s. 2d.

III. And be it enacted, that the Treasurer of the said Colony shall issue and pay the said sums to such persons for the purposes hereinafter mentioned, upon such days, and in such proportions as the Governor for the time being, by any warrant or order signed by him, shall from time to time order and direct, and that the payment so made shall be charged upon and payable out of the Revenue of the said Colony.

IV. And be it enacted, that the said Treasurer shall in his accounts from time to time, be allowed credit for any sum or sums of money paid by him in pursuance of such warrant or order in writing as aforesaid, and that the receipt or receipts of the respective persons to whom the same shall be so paid, shall be a full and valid discharge to the said Treasurer in passing his said accounts, for any such sum or sums of money as shall be therein mentioned,

and that he shall and do receive credit for the same accordingly.

NO. VII.

An Ordinance to amend the Laws relating to Publicans' Licenses.

WHEREAS an Act was passed in the Fourth and Fifth years of the Reign of Her present Majesty entitled "An Act for repealing the Laws now in force relating to the licensing and regulating of Public Houses, and for the better regulating the granting of Licenses for the sale of Ale, Beer, Wine, Spirits, and other Liquors in Western Australia in future." and whereas it is expedient to amend the said Act in several respects.—Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia, by and with the consent of the Legislative Council thereof, that it shall be lawful for two Justices to exercise all the powers and perform all the acts directed to be exercised and performed by three Justices according to the said Act—Provided always that nothing in this Act contained shall be construed to repeal the fifteenth clause of an Act passed in the Seventh year of the Reign of Her present Majesty entitled "An Act to regulate summary

proceedings before Justices of the Peace."

NO. VIII.

An Ordinance to adopt certain Improvements made in the Law of England respecting Libel.

Whereas a certain Act of Parliament was passed in the Sixth and Seventh [years of the Reign of Her present Majesty entitled "An Act to amend the Law respecting Defamatory words and Libel;" and whereas it is expedient to adopt and apply the said Act to the Administration of Justice in this Colony—Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia and its Dependencies by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, that the said Act and every clause, provision, and enactment therein respectively contained, shall be and the same is hereby adopted and directed to be applied in the Administration of Justice, so far as they can be applied respectively to the circumstances of this colony.

Licenses to occupy Lands.

Complaints having been made of much inconvenience and annoyance being occasioned to Owners of Land in fee simple, in consequence of licenses being obtained to depasture lands contiguous to their boundaries, without their knowledge and without any opportunity being given of informing themselves of such applications, and of applying on their own behalf. His Excellency, therefore, with a view to remove the ground of such complaints, has directed it to be published for general information, that, henceforth, all application for such Licenses will be published in the Government Gazette for one month, in order to give the Owner in Fee-simple of any contiguous lands, an opportunity of applying within that period for the same block of land, in which case he will be considered entitled to a preference, and should two or more owners, in fee simple, of contiguous lands, be affected by the required Licenses, the right to it, as between such owners only, and to the exclusion of any person not so interested, must be decided by Auction.
