the right to all Timber and Stone, *except such as may be required for public purposes*, upon the Crown Lands surrounding the Townsite of Fremantle to a distance of four miles on the left bank of the Swan, and on the right bank to within four miles from the Town boundary of Perth, being vested in the Trustees of the town of Fremantle, the proceeds arising from the sale of such property to be appropriated to the improvement of the Town :—Notice is hereby given, that

all parties desirous of obtaining Licenses to cut Timber or Firewood, or to quarry Stone, within the above boundaries, must apply to the Chairman of the Trust.
