EXTRACT FROM EARL GREY'S DESPATCH,  
DATED THE 13TH DECEMBER, 1851.

"But I look upon the supply of a small steamer to traffic on the Swan River as an object of great importance to all interests in Western Australia, and should the construction of the proposed vessel hereafter be completed, I shall be happy if its size will permit, to use my best endeavors to procure its conveyance to the colony in one or more convict ships either free of charge or on the most advantageous terms which circumstances will allow."
