**Proclamation.**

By His Excellency CHARLES FITZGERALD, Esquire, Commander in the Royal Navy, Governor and Commander-in-Chief, in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies and Vice-Admiral of the same.

IN pursuance of the authority in me vested by a certain Act of the Imperial Parliament, passed in the 5th and 6th years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for regulating the sale of Waste Lands belonging to the crown in the Australian Colonies," I do hereby notify and proclaim that the following portions of land will be offered for Sale by Public Auction, by the Collector and Sub-Collectors of Revenue, at the places and on the days hereinafter mentioned, at one o'clock at the upset price affixed to each lot respectively, on the terms and conditions set forth in certain Land Regulations, dated June, 1843:—

By the Sub-Collector of Revenue at the Vasse, on Wednesday, the 4th of August next:—

*Sussex Location, No. 24.*—Comprising (20) Twenty acres more or less, extending 14 chains 14 links east and 14 chains 14 links north from a spot 27 chains east from south-east corner of Sussex Location No. 10, opposite boundaries parallel and equal, and all bearings and boundaries true. Upset price £1 per acre.

By the Collector of Revenue, at Perth, on Wednesday, the 4th August next,—

*Avon Location No. 96.*—Comprising 10 acres more or less, in form of a square extending magnetic S.S.E. and magnetic E.N.E., the centre of the square being the centre of a spring known as "Beclecan," situate about 67 chains E.N.E. from Stanton's spring.

By the Sub-Collector of Revenue, at Bunbury, on Wednesday, the 11th August next,—

*Wellington Location No. 81.*—Comprising 20

acres more or less, bounded on the South-east by 10 chains of the N.W. boundary of Location 41, and on the South-west by a line perpendicular thereto 20 chains; opposite boundaries parallel and equal, and the South corner 9 chains from E. corner of Location 62. Upset price £1 per acre.

By the Sub-Collector of Revenue, at Fremantle, on Wednesday, the 4th August:

*Swan Location No. 139.*—Comprising 58 acres more or less, being the vacant space between Swan Location 71 and 72, and bounded on the south by the south boundary of Fremantle Town-site. Upset price £1 per acre.

HIS Excellency the Governor directs the following Rules and Regulations for the Customs Department at Fremantle, to be published for the information of the public.

Custom House, Fremantle,  
July 1st, 1852.

Hours of business from 10 till 4 o'clock.  
Clearances for ships and goods, and entries for goods in the Bonded Stores can only be passed till 3 o'clock.

Goods can be taken out of the Bonded Store till 3 o'clock.

Custom House closes on Saturdays at one o'clock.

All duties and charges paid to the Government must be in Bank Notes or Coin, Che-

ques, except marked "Good" by the Bank, will not be received.

Holidays are Christmas Day, Good Friday, Queen's Accession and Birthday, and the Anniversary of the Foundation of the colony.

From 1st September to 30th April Goods will be permitted to be landed from 8 o'clock a.m., till 5 o'clock p.m., and from 1st May to 31st August from 9 a.m., till 4 p.m.

All spirits or goods for Warehousing, to be delivered at the Bonded Stores, and stowed away at the expense of the Proprietor, under the superintendence of the Government Cooper; as likewise the delivery of the same from the Warehouse; and if any spirits, or goods liable to duty, be kept on the beach by the proprietor, and not removed to the Bonded Stores immediately when landed, the expense of watching, after the above named hours, or carrying the same to the Bonded Stores, at the option of the officer, will be made chargeable thereon.

The Government do not hold themselves liable for any leakage, but any cask requiring cooping will be done by the Government Cooper at the expense of the proprietor.

Boatman to deliver the Permit he receives from the officer on board, at the Custom House, or deliver it to a Custom House Officer immediately on his landing, and previous to his discharging any of his cargo into his flat.

All Boatmen landing goods before the above named hours, without the presence of some Custom House Officer, will subject himself to forfeiture of his License.
