**Proclamation.**

By His Excellency CHARLES FITZGERALD,  
Esquire, Commander in the Royal Navy,  
Governor and Commander-in-Chief, in  
and over the Territory of Western Aus-  
tralia and its Dependencies and Vice-Ad-  
miral of the same.

IN pursuance of the authority in me ves-  
ted by a certain Act of the Imperial  
Parliament, passed in the 5th and 6th  
years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled  
'An Act for regulating the sale of Waste  
Lands belonging to the crown in the Aus-  
tralian Colonies,' I do hereby notify and  
proclaim that the following portions of  
land will be offered for Sale by Public  
Auction, by the Collector and Sub-Colle-  
ctors of Revenue, at the places and on the  
days hereinafter mentioned, at one o'clock  
at the upset price affixed to each lot re-  
spectively, on the terms and conditions set  
forth in certain Land Regulations, dated  
June, 1843 :—

By the Sub-Collector of Revenue, at  
Bunbury, on Wednesday, the 11th August  
next,—

Wellington Location No. 81—Comprising 20  
acres more or less, bounded on the South-east by  
10 chains of the N.W. boundary of Location 41,  
and on the South-west by a line perpendicular  
thereto 20 chains; opposite boundaries parallel  
and equal, and the South corner 9 chains from E.  
corner of Location 62. Upset price £1 per acre.
