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**Proclamation.**

By His Excellency CHARLES FITZGERALD,  
Esquire, Commander in the Royal Navy,  
Governor and Commander-in-Chief, in  
and over the Territory of Western Aus-  
tralia and its Dependencies and Vice-Ad-  
miral of the same.

IN pursuance of the authority in me ves-  
ted by a certain Act of the Imperial  
Parliament, passed in the 5th and 6th  
years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled  
"An Act for regulating the sale of Waste  
Lands belonging to the crown in the Aus-  
tralian Colonies," I do hereby notify and  
proclaim that the following portions of  
land will be offered for Sale by Public  
Auction, by the Collector and Sub-Collec-  
tor of Revenue, at the places and on the  
days hereinafter mentioned, at one o'clock  
at the upset price affixed to each lot re-  
spectively, on the terms and conditions set  
forth in certain Land Regulations, dated  
June, 1843:—

At Perth, on the 2nd March 1853.

Avon Location No. 104—Comprising 10 acres  
more or less bounded on the NE by Avon Loca-  
tion No. 103 of 15  $\frac{1}{2}$  acres on the NW by the  
Avon River—on the SW by location V of G.  
Lloy's and a Public cemetery and vacant land—and  
on the SE by the new Avon road. Upset price,  
£1 per acre.

Avon Location No. 105—Comprising 1 acre  
2 roods 13 perches more or less bounded on the  
SE by G. Lilley's Avon Location No 74, on the  
NE by location 83 and on the West by the new  
Avon road. Upset price, £1 per acre.

At Albany, on the 28th day of February  
1853:—

Plantagenet Location No. 63—Comprising 30  
acres more or less, bounded on the West by 10  
chains of East boundary of James Arber's Loca-

existence of a well grounded suspicion that  
had search warrants been granted such a  
course would have been followed by the  
recovery of stolen property and the detec-  
tion of criminals.

With a view of obviating this difficulty His Excellency the Governor having taken into consideration the peculiar circumstances of this colony and the absolute necessity of affording every facility for the detection of crime proposes laying before the Legislative Council at its next meeting a measure to enable Justices of the Peace upon any reasonable grounds of suspicion stated to them in writing under the hand of the person making such statement and whether upon oath or otherwise to issue a search warrant enabling the proper officer to search any number of houses named in such warrant by day or by night.

His Excellency is therefore desirous to give all the publicity in his power to such his intention that the public may have full opportunity for expression of opinion thereon.
