Proclamation.

By His Excellency CHARLES FITZGERALD,
*Esquire, Commander in the Royal Navy,
 Governor and Commander-in-Chief, in
 and over the Territory of Western Aus-
 tralia and its Dependencies and Vice-Ad-
 miral of the same.*

IN pursuance of the authority in me vested by a certain Act of the Imperial Parliament, passed in the 5th and 6th years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for regulating the sale of Waste Lands belonging to the crown in the Australian Colonies," I do hereby notify and proclaim that the following portions of land will be offered for Sale by Public Auction, by the Collector and Sub-Collector of Revenue, at the places and on the days hereinafter mentioned, at one o'clock at the upset price affixed to each lot respectively, on the terms and conditions set forth in certain Land Regulations, dated June, 1843:—

At Perth, on the 2nd March 1853.

Avon Location No. 104—Comprising 10 acres more or less bounded on the NE by Avon Location No. 103 of 15 ½ acres on the NW by the Avon River—on the SW by location V of G. Lloyd's and a Public cemetery and vacant land—and on the SE by the new Avon road. Upset price, £1 per acre.

Avon Location No. 105—Comprising 1 acre 2 roods 13 perches more or less bounded on the SE by G. Lilley's Avon Location No 74, on the NE by location 83 and on the West by the new Avon road. Upset price, £1 per acre.
