**Proclamation.**

By His Excellency CHARLES FITZGERALD,  
Esquire, Commander in the Royal Navy,  
Governor and Commander-in-Chief, in  
and over the Territory of Western Aus-  
tralia and its Dependencies and Vice-Ad-  
miral of the same.

IN pursuance of the authority in me ves-  
ted by a certain Act of the Imperial  
Parliament, passed in the 5th and 6th  
years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled  
"An Act for regulating the sale of Waste  
Lands belonging to the crown in the Aus-  
tralian Colonies," I do hereby notify and  
proclaim that the following portions of  
land will be offered for Sale by Public  
Auction, by the Collector and Sub-Collec-  
tor of Revenue, at the places and on the  
days hereinafter mentioned, at one o'clock  
at the upset price affixed to each lot re-  
spectively, on the terms and conditions set  
forth in certain Land Regulations, dated  
June, 1843:—

*At Perth, on the 6th day of April:—*

*Murray Location No. 30.*—Comprising 10 acres  
more or less, bounded on the South by South  
boundary of Warrangup reserve, on the West by  
a North line 6½ chains, on the North by a line  
parallel to South boundary, and to the East by  
Harvey Estuary; all bearings true. Upset price  
£1 per acre.

*Murray Location No. 31.*—Comprising 10 acres  
more or less, bounded on the North by the North  
boundary of Warrangup reserve, on the West by  
a South line 5 chains 37 links, on the South by a  
line parallel to North boundary, and on the East

**Abstract from a Code of Rules  
for the Western Australian  
Police Force.**

UNDER the general authority of His  
Excellency the Governor, the Superinten-  
dent will have the entire control of the  
Force both Horse and Foot. On him  
alone, assisted by his officers, will devolve  
the important responsibility of the gene-  
ral efficiency, moral conduct, and discipline.

The Superintendent will have at all  
times to co-operate with the Magistrates  
in carrying out the different acts or regu-  
lations issued by His Excellency the Go-  
vernor for the suppression, detection, and  
prevention of crime.

The Deputy Superintendent will assist  
the Superintendent, and in the latter's  
absence act for him.

The Sergeants will devote their whole

time to the Service, and see that all orders given by the Superintendent or senior authority are strictly enforced.

The Constables will obey their superiors and likewise devote their entire time to the Service. They will not be allowed to trade or do any menial service. They will be most vigilant and not pass over the least part of their prescribed duties. They will use civility to all parties as far as it is consistent with the proper discharge of their lawful duties. They will pay the strictest attention to the suppression, prevention, and detection of crime. They will exercise their authority from the Local Police Laws, and from further orders they may from time to time receive from the Magistrates through the medium of their Superintendent or the superior officer of the Station. They will exercise no harshness or violence except in self defence, or in the resolute and lawful execution of their duties.

The whole Force will at all times be on duty, except when special leave is granted.

Any gratuity wished to be given to the Police must be forwarded through the Superintendent.

**H**IS Excellency the Governor has directed the publication of the following Heads of Bills to be submitted to the Legislative Council at its next meeting.

1. An Ordinance to prohibit Sales by Auction between sunset and sunrise.

2. An Ordinance to subject Vessels visiting the Ports of Western Australia and receiving on board any passengers or goods on freight, to the payment of Pilotage Fees.

3. An Ordinance to provide a remedy against the unauthorised slaughter of Kangaroos.

No person to hunt Kangaroos without an authority in writing from a Justice of the Peace

Not to extend to owners or occupiers of country lands or their servants for their own consumption or that of their establishments, or to the Aboriginal Natives hunting for their own use

Export duty of 1s. imposed on each Kangaroo Skin.

4. An Ordinance to shorten and interpret the language of Ordinances, and to render unnecessary repetitions therein.

5. An Ordinance to enable Trustees to surrender, exchange, or sell lands vested in them for public purposes, under the Acts No. 1 1838, No. 6 1840, No. 7 1842, and No. 15 1850.

6. An Ordinance to authorise Justices of the Peace to issue Search Warrants without information on oath, and to enact additional police regulations.

Justices may grant search warrants upon reasonable grounds stated in writing, and signed by the person making such statement, authorising the proper officers to search by

day or by night any house or number of houses named in such warrants.

Constable may demand name and address and apprehend any person who shall neglect or refuse to give same.

7. An Ordinance to provide for the removal of Boundary Posts erected under the Ordinance passed in 1844, No. 8, and for the substitution under certain circumstances of other Boundary Marks.

8. An Ordinance to make further provision for the Licensing of Boats and Boatmen, and for the preservation of Jetties, &c.

9. An Ordinance to make further provision for the due Custody and Discipline of Offenders transported to Western Australia, and of Offenders sentenced therein to Transportation.

10. A Bill to regulate the temporal affairs of Churches and Chapels of the United Church of England and Ireland in Western Australia.
