**Proclamation.**

By His Excellency CHARLES FITZGERALD,  
Esquire, Commander in the Royal Navy,  
Governor and Commander-in-Chief, in  
and over the Territory of Western Aus-  
tralia and its Dependencies and Vice-Ad-  
miral of the same.

IN pursuance of the authority in me ves-  
ted by a certain Act of the Imperial  
Parliament, passed in the 5th and 6th  
years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled  
"An Act for regulating the sale of Waste  
Lands belonging to the crown in the Aus-  
tralian Colonies," I do hereby notify and  
proclaim that the following portions of  
land will be offered for Sale by Public  
Auction, by the Collector and Sub-Collec-  
tor of Revenue, at the places and on the  
days hereinafter mentioned, at one o'clock  
at the upset price affixed to each lot re-  
spectively, on the terms and conditions set  
forth in certain Land Regulations, dated  
June, 1843:—

At Perth on the 4th May next:

*Cockburn Sound Location No. 41*—Comprising  
20 acres more or less, bounded on the North by  
South boundary of A. Curtis's Location No. 42,  
and on the East by 10 chains 52 links of West  
boundary of W. Gibson's Location No. 40; op-  
posite boundaries parallel and equal and all true.  
Upset price £1 per acre.

Perth Lot W 5. Upset price £15.

*Murray Location No. 42*—Comprising 15 acres  
more or less, on left bank of Murray River,  
bounded on the North by 22 chains 45 links of  
South boundary of J. Cooper's Location No. 13,  
on the West by a South line 8 chains, on the  
South by an East line to the Murray, and on the  
West by said River, all boundaries true. Upset
