Proclamation.

By His Excellency CHARLES FITZGERALD, Esquire, Commander in the Royal Navy, Governor and Commander-in-Chief, in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies and Vice-Admiral of the same.

IN pursuance of the authority in me vested by a certain Act of the Imperial Parliament, passed in the 5th and 6th years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for regulating the sale of Waste Lands belonging to the crown in the Australian Colonies," I do hereby notify and proclaim that the following portions of land will be offered for Sale by Public Auction, by the Collector and Sub-Collector of Revenue, at the places and on the days hereinafter mentioned, at one o'clock at the upset price affixed to each lot respectively, on the terms and conditions set forth in certain Land Regulations, dated June, 1843:—

At Perth, on Wednesday, 6th day of July:

*Cockburn Sound Location No. 48—*Comprising 10 acres more or less, bounded on the East by C. Spencer's 25 acre location No. 39, on the West by a South line 22 chains 53 links along East boundary of B. Baldwin's Location No. 30, on the North by the River Serpentine, and on the South by an East line 5 chains 93 links; all boundaries true. Upset price £1 per acre.

Perth Lots Y 38 and Y 39. Upset price £15 each.

*Regulations for the management of the
Public Jetty in Perth, in accordance
with the Provisions of the Ordinance
16th Vic. No. 20, 1853.*

1. No vessel or boat to be fastened to any part of the Public Jetty in Perth, except to such ring bolts or other fastenings as may be expressly provided for the purpose; and no vessel or boat to lie alongside of such Jetty unless so fastened; all cargo boats so fastened to be also anchored in such manner as to relieve the Jetty as much as possible from the weight of such boats.

2. No vessel or boat to be so fastened except for the purpose of loading or unloading, or for any longer period than may be reasonably required for such purpose.

3. All vessels and boats so fastened to be loaded and unloaded with all possible dispatch, and in such a manner as not to injure the Jetty.

4. No vessel or boat to lie alongside the steps on either side of the Jetty longer than may be necessary to embark and disembark passengers.

5. Every description of cargo may be left for loading upon or landed on the Jetty, except stone, bricks, clay, sand, lime, firewood, timber in logs, tryports, cannon, or ships anchors.

6. All cargo landed to be removed within 48 hours.

7. No articles of any kind to be landed or left upon any part of the Jetty except upon the Wooden Platform forming the head thereof, nor in such a position as to interfere with the free passage of passengers, or of horses and carts.

8. No bullock teams to be driven on the Jetty.

9. No boat or vessel to make fast to, or lie alongside the Jetty, between 8 p.m. and 4 a.m., unless discharging or taking in cargo or passengers.

10. No gunpowder to be left on any part of the Jetty without a keeper, and without being well covered by a tarpaulin.

11. No stones, or any kind of substance whatever, to be thrown into the water from the Jetty, or from boats lying near it.

12. Heavy goods landed at the Jetty-head must be carted or wheeled away, and may not be dragged over the planking.

13. No goods to be landed or removed from the Jetty on Sunday, except in cases of emergency.

N.B.—All Perth Constables have been instructed to see that these Regulations are carried into effect.
