Proclamation.

By His Excellency CHARLES FITZGERALD,
Esquire, Commander in the Royal Navy,
Governor and Commander-in-Chief, in
and over the Territory of Western Aus-
tralia and its Dependencies and Vice-Ad-
miral of the same.

IN pursuance of the authority in me vested by a certain Act of the Imperial Parliament, passed in the 5th and 6th years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for regulating the sale of Waste Lands belonging to the crown in the Australian Colonies," I do hereby notify and proclaim that the following portions of land will be offered for Sale by Public Auction, by the Collector and Sub-Collector of Revenue, at the places and on the days hereinafter mentioned, at one o'clock at the upset price affixed to each lot respectively, on the terms and conditions set forth in certain Land Regulations, dated June, 1843:—

At Perth, on Wednesday, 7th day of September next:

Marchison Location No. 4—Comprising 100 acres more or less, extending 31 chains 61 links East and West, and the same distance North and South, the centre of the block being the centre of a pit dug in the ground about 98 chains East 15 degrees South from N.E. corner of the Geraldine Mining Company's location No 1—opposite boundaries parallel and equal and all true. Upset price £1 per acre. *This land is known to contain Minerals, and further information concerning it may be obtained at the Survey Office.*

TENDERS (in duplicate) will be received at this office up to noon of

TUESDAY, the 4th October next, for the conveyance of Mails throughout the colony from the 1st January 1854, to the 31st December 1855 inclusive.

The Tenders may embrace the whole or any portion of the undermentioned lines:

The last Tender must include the conveyance of all steamers and other ships mails from the Sound.

Parties Tendering are not obliged to tender for the two years but may if they think fit, confine themselves to the year 1854.

Tenders must state the rate per mile at which the contractor will undertake to convey additional or express mails; the mode in which it is intended to convey the mail, whether on horseback or in a spring-cart; and the probable time he will take in conveying it to its destination.

The arrivals and departures of mails will be subject to instructions from the General Post Office, and liable to alteration at any time during the year.

Two approved sureties will be required to join the contractor in a bond for the due fulfilment of the duties respectively contracted to be performed.

No payments will be made on account of any Mail contract until such Bond shall have been respectively signed by the contractor and his sureties; and any breach of contract, in the wilful or negligent departure or delivery of mails at the appointed days and hours will subject the contractor to the loss of a proportionate part of his months pay.

Tenders to be inscribed "Tenders for conveyance of Mails", and each Tender to bear the signatures of the proposed sureties.

Parties tendering to attend on the day appointed for the opening of these Tenders, when those parties whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the amount of security, they will respectively be required to give.
