HIS Excellency the Governor has directed the publication of the following Titles of Bills proposed to be submitted to the Legislative Council at its next session.

A Bill to consolidate the law relating to the Registration of Deeds, Wills, and Judgments and Conveyances affecting real property.

A Bill for declaring valid certain Instruments and transactions affecting titles to lands in Western Australia.

A Bill to abolish the franking of official letters.

A Bill to declare and extend the powers of the Governor to alienate lands purchased out of Imperial or out of Colonial Funds, and to establish and quiet the titles of *bonâ fide* purchasers thereof.

A Bill to give further remedies to creditors against persons removing from one Australasian colony to another.

A Bill to consolidate and amend the law respecting the Registration of Births, Deaths, and Marriages in Western Australia.

A Bill to enable the Members of a certain Society at Perth, in the colony of Western Australia, called the Total Abstinence Society, to raise a sum of 300*l.* on their lands and premises situate in the colony of Western Australia, and for other purposes therein contained.

A Bill to amend the existing laws respecting the management of Towns and to make more efficient provision for their improvement, and for the security of life and property therein.

A Bill to repeal the Saving's Bank Ordinance, passed in the 18th year of the reign of Her Majesty No. 3.

A Bill to facilitate inquiries in the nature of Coroners inquests.

A Bill to provide for the relief of insolvent debtors in custody, and for the ratable division of all the property of insolvent debtors among their creditors.

A Bill for the naturalization of Charles Miller.

A Bill to substitute other punishment in lieu of transportation.

A Bill to enlarge the remedies of creditors against the persons of their debtors.

A Bill for the appropriation of the Revenue.

That the rate of Light Dues to be charged on Vessels entering Port Adelaide from Great Britain, Mauritius, the Cape, India, and Foreign Ports, be as follows—

3d in per ton, and 3d out per ton.

That the rate of Light Dues to be charged on Vessels entering Port Ade-

laide from Victoria, Van Diemen's Land, and the other Australian Colonies, shall be as follows:

1½d in per ton, and 1½d out per ton.

And the rate of Light Dues to be charged on Vessels Coastwise:

From 30 to 50 tons, per voyage	0	3	0
