**Road from Toodyay towards Bindoon.**

**I**T is hereby notified for general information, pursuant to the Ordinance No 19 of the 10th Victoria, that a line of road from Toodyay Brook towards Bindoon has recently been laid out and Surveyed according to the following description, and that the same will henceforth be deemed a public line of communication.

The road is one chain wide on the South and Western sides of the following magnetic lines, and is marked at its several angles by stout square posts.

### Regulations for the guidance of District Registrars of Births, Deaths, and Marriages in the Colony of Western Australia.

EVERY District Registrar is to make known as generally as possible the provisions of the Colonial Ordinance No 12 of the 19th Victoria, and see that the regulations contained therein for the due registration of Births, Deaths, and Marriages are strictly enforced.

District Registrars will use due diligence in keeping themselves informed of all Births, Deaths, or Marriages occurring in their respective Districts; and, in the event of their registration being respectively, wilfully, or negligently withheld, will cause the offender to be summoned before the two nearest Justices of the Peace with a

view to such punishment being awarded as to the Bench may seem fit.

The attention of District Registrars is called to the necessity of obtaining the fullest information in regard to Births. The date and place of Birth should be given together with the Profession, Trade, or Calling, of the Father and the informant should not only be called upon to sign the Register, but to add also his or her place of residence and calling; and, if he or she be related to the child, the degree of relationship should be mentioned. The legitimacy or otherwise of the child should be ascertained by the District Registrar, and in the latter case, duly reported to the Registrar General. The registration of still born children is also required.

Similar importance attaches to obtaining particulars in regard to Deaths. The age of any deceased person, the date and place of death and the nature of the disease which terminated his or her existence should be carefully ascertained and registered.

District Registrars are particularly enjoined to fill up the duplicate certificates, to be transmitted to the Registrar General, in a clear and legible manner, as the names of parties, although familiar in the Districts where they reside, are unknown to the Registrar General, and often, from the careless manner in which the Certificates are filled up, cannot be deciphered at the General Registry.

The attention of District Registrars is called to the 32nd Section of the Registration Ordinance.

## PROCLAMATION.

*By His Excellency* ARTHUR EDWARD KENNEDY, Esq., *Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies and Vice-Admiral of the same*

WHEREAS it is enacted, by the 4th Section of an Ordinance passed in the 19th Year of Her Majesty Queen Victoria No 12, entitled "An Ordinance for the better Registration of Births, Deaths and Marriages in the Colony of Western Australia," that the Governor may, for the purposes of such Ordinance, divide the said Colony into such and so many Registry districts as he shall think fit, one of them being the Registry District of Perth. Now therefore I, Arthur Edward Kennedy, the Governor aforesaid with the advice of my Executive Council,

do hereby proclaim, that for the purposes of the said Ordinance, the Colony shall be divided into the following Registry Districts:—

District of Perth  
 " of Fremantle  
 " of Guildford  
 " of York  
 " of Toodyay  
 " of Murray  
 " of Bunbury  
 " of Vasse  
 " of Albany  
 " of Victoria.
