Pasturage on York Townsite.

THE Government having hitherto deemed it advisable to allow the resident inhabitants of any occupied Townsite the free use of the natural pasturage over the unappropriated portions of such townsite, for the purpose of grazing a few head of cattle or horses thereon, and frequent complaint having been made that such a privilege on York Townsite is rendered useless by the daily presence of several flocks of sheep feeding it down and watering at its summer pools, His Excellency the Governor is pleased to direct that after the 1st January next, all sheep found grazing on the public lands of the above Townsite, except such as may be passing with all convenient speed to and from water at the First and Second Mile Pools, will be deemed to be trespassing on Crown land, and will be dealt with accordingly.

Reduction of Postage on Letters to the United Kingdom.

NOTICE is hereby given for general information that on and after the 1st January next the Postage upon Letters conveyed by packet via Southampton or private ship, between this colony and the United Kingdom, will be reduced to a combined British and Colonial rate of 6d for a letter not exceeding $\frac{1}{2}$ an ounce in weight 1s for a letter exceeding $\frac{1}{2}$ an ounce and not exceeding 1 ounce.

2s for a letter exceeding 1 ounce and not exceeding 2 ounces.

and so on increasing one shilling for every additional ounce or fraction of an ounce.

Letters forwarded via Marseilles will be chargeable with an extra rate of

5d the $\frac{1}{4}$ ounce; thus upon every letter under $\frac{1}{4}$ ounce, one rate.

weighing $\frac{1}{4}$ ounce and under $\frac{1}{2}$ ounce, two rates.

" $\frac{1}{2}$ " " $\frac{3}{4}$ " three rates.

" $\frac{3}{4}$ " " 1 " four rates.

and so on increasing one additional rate for each $\frac{1}{4}$ of an ounce.

The Postage upon Letters to the United Kingdom may be paid in advance, or the

letters may be forwarded unpaid at the option of the sender.
