Pasturage on York Townsite.

THE Government having hitherto deemed it advisable to allow the resident inhabitants of any occupied Town-

site the free use of the natural pasturage over the unappropriated portions of such townsite, for the purpose of grazing a few head of cattle or horses thereon, and frequent complaint having been made that such a privilege on York Townsite is rendered useless by the daily presence of several flocks of sheep feeding it down and watering at its summer pools, His Excellency the Governor is pleased to direct that after the 1st January next, all sheep found grazing on the public lands of the above Townsite, except such as may be passing with all convenient speed to and from water at the First and Second Mile Pools, will be deemed to be trespassing on Crown land, and will be dealt with accordingly.
