Length over all, 25 feet

Breadth, 5 feet

Depth, 1 foot 10 inches.

The Boat to be sletcher built, keel, gunwales, stem and stern post to be mahogany. Planking, thwarts, rising and lining to be Pine.

Keel to be 3 inches in depth clear of garboard streak.

Stern post to be straight with rudder and tiller.

Floors between every two timbers, close lined up to rising, with mast step, mast thwart to be double kneed with 3 inch hole for mast.

The whole to be copper fastened, and covered with two coats of lead color paint.

Hoisting straps forward and aft to be fitted, and four iron crutches to be provided.

For further particulars apply to the Harbour Master, Fremantle, to whose approval the boat will be subject on completion.

**Pasturage on York Townsite.**

**T**HE Government having hitherto deemed it advisable to allow the resident inhabitants of any occupied Town-

site the free use of the natural pasturage over the unappropriated portions of such townsite, for the purpose of grazing a few head of cattle or horses thereon, and frequent complaints having been made that such a privilege on York Townsite is rendered useless by the daily presence of several flocks of sheep feeding it down and watering at its summer pools, His Excellency the Governor is pleased to direct that after the 1st January next, all sheep found grazing on the public lands of the above Townsite, except such as may be passing with all convenient speed to and from water at the First and Second Mile Pools, will be deemed to be trespassing on Crown land, and will be dealt with accordingly.
