Tenders for a Whale Boat.

SEALD TENDERS (in duplicate) endorsed "Tenders for a Whale Boat," will be received at this office until noon of 26th February, 1857, from persons willing to construct a four-oared Whale Boat, required for the Pilot service at King George's Sound, according to the undermentioned specification, viz.:

Length over all, 25 feet
Breadth, 5 feet
Depth, 1 foot 10 inches.

The Boat to be clincher built, keel, gunwales, stem and stern post to be mahogany. Planking, thwarts, rising and lining to be Pine.

Keel to be 3 inches in depth clear of garboard streak.

Stern post to be straight with rudder and tiller.

Floors between every two timbers, close inling up to rising, with mast step, mast thwart to be double kneed with 3 inch hole for mast.

The whole to be copper fastened, and covered with two coats of lead color paint.

Hoisting straps forward and aft to be fitted, and four iron crutches to be provided.

For further particulars apply to the Harbour Master, Fremantle, to whose approval the boat will be subject on completion.

Tenders to state the time in which such boat can be completed.
