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**Proclamation.**

By His Excellency ARTHUR EDWARD KENNEDY, Esquire, Governor and Commander in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same.

WHEREAS the undermentioned Ordinances passed by His Excellency Arthur Edward Kennedy, Esquire, Governor of the said Colony, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof in the Nineteenth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, and intitled:—

No. 11. An Ordinance to amend and consolidate the Laws affecting the Solemnization of Marriage in the Colony of Western Australia.

No. 12. An Ordinance for the better Registration of Births, Deaths and Marriages in the Colony of Western Australia.

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Edward Kennedy, do hereby proclaim and make known unto all whom it may concern that Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to confirm and allow the before mentioned Ordinances.

HER Majesty's Secretary of State for the Colonies having been pleased to authorise His Excellency the Governor to announce that the payment of Passage Money will not in future be required from Ticket-of-Leave holders, and also to remit any outstanding arrears, under such regulations of detail, as he may deem proper under the circumstances.

His Excellency is pleased to direct that the date on which such payment shall be considered to have ceased, shall be the 28th FEBRUARY, 1857; and that all sums due up to that date, shall be required from Ticket-of-leave holders, prior to their receiving their Conditional Pardons, except in those cases in which he may be recommended by the Comptroller General of Convicts to remit the same.

All Ticket-of-Leave holders who have paid more than would have become due on the 28th February, 1857, at the rate of £5 per annum will have such over payment refunded to them on application to the Commissariat in the District to which they belonged at the above date; where there is no Commissariat, as at Toodyay, York, Port Gregory, and Champion Bay, the sums will be repaid by the Comptroller General through the Resident Magistrate and vouchers forwarded for signature at the time of payment.

The following is the list of men entitled to refund, and it is to be understood that no claim for such refund will be entertained after the 31st March, 1858.

### Steam Postal Communication

Between Melbourne and Launceston or Hobart Town, between Melbourne and Adelaide, and between Melbourne and Sydney and Auckland, in connection with the Steam Postal communication between the United Kingdom, Melbourne and Sydney, undertaken by the European and Australian Royal Mail Company, under contract dated the 14th day of October, 1856.

**TENDERS** for the conveyance of Mails by steam vessels between the under-mentioned ports will be received by the Government of Victoria until Saturday, the 30th day of May, addressed to the Treasurer, and endorsed, "Tender for Steam Service."

- (1.) From Melbourne to Launceston or Hobart Town, and from Launceston or Hobart Town to Melbourne, once in every month.
- (2.) From Melbourne to Adelaide, and from Adelaide to Melbourne, once in every month.
- (3.) From Melbourne or Sydney to Auckland, and from Auckland to Melbourne or Sydney, once in every month.

Each tender will state the tonnage, power and description of the vessel, the number of days proposed for the voyage each way, and the sum for which the service will be performed. The vessels employed for these services will be required, at the contractors expense, to take mails from the mail ship in the port of Melbourne or in the port of Sydney, as the case may be, and to proceed on their respective voyages, as follows, viz :—

To Launceston or Hobart Town, within three hours or six hours, and to Adelaide within three hours, or six hours, or twelve hours from the arrival in Hobson's Bay of the mail ship. The difference in the amount of tender for each period of starting as above after the arrival of the mail ship must be specified.

To Auckland, within six hours, or twelve hours or twenty four hours from the arrival of the mail ship in Hobson's Bay, or at her anchorage in the port of Sydney, accordingly as the contract may be taken from Melbourne or Sydney. The difference in the amount of tender for each period of starting as above must be specified.

A penalty of £20 will be incurred by the respective contractors for every hour's delay in sailing beyond the number of hours respectively abovementioned.

A penalty of £50 will be incurred by the respective contractors for every day on the voyage beyond the time allowed, and a proportionate part of such penalty for any period less than a day over the time allowed.

The vessels employed for these services will be required to leave their respective ports for Melbourne or Sydney, as the case may be, with the homeward mails, in time to catch the homeward mail ship in the port of Melbourne or the port of Sydney, as the case may be, and to put the mails on board such ship, which they will

do at the contractor's expense, provided that not more than the maximum time allowed for the respective voyages shall intervene between the time of departure from their respective ports and the stated time of departure of the mail ship homeward from the port of Melbourne or the port of Sydney, as the case may be.

In case any steam vessel employed in these services shall not arrive in time to put her mails on board the mail ships homeward bound. the contractor shall be liable to a penalty of £200.

The duration of the contract shall be for twelve months. The tenderer to name the date when the service can be entered upon.

The contractors will be required to enter into a bond with two sureties, to the extent of half the amount of the contract, for the due performance of the service.

The lowest tender will not necessarily be accepted, nor indeed any tender.

### Road from Fremantle towards the Canning Bridge.

IT is hereby notified for general information that, pursuant to ordinance Vic. 10 No 19, a public road to the undermentioned extent from Fremantle towards the Canning Bridge, has been laid out and partly made, and that the same is declared to be a public line of communication sixty-six feet in width.

From the eastern boundary of Fremantle Townsite the road crosses the West and East boundaries of Swan Location 62 about 2½ chains South from the Swan River and then extends in an easterly direction to S.W. corner of location 176, passing East between that location and Nos 71 & 139.

A more full and particular description of this road will be published when the entire line can be surveyed, and in the mean time persons are warned against fencing across any portion of the road now in use between Fremantle and the Perth causeway, via the Canning Bridge below Bull's Creek.
