Proclamation.

By His Excellency ARTHUR EDWARD KENNEDY, Esq., Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same.

IN pursuance of the authority in me vested by a certain Act of the Imperial Parliament of Great Britain and Ireland, passed in the 5th and 6th years of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act for regulating the sale of Waste Lands belonging to the Crown in the Australian Colonies," I do hereby notify and proclaim, that the following portion of Land will be offered for sale by public auction, by the Collector of Revenue at Perth, on Wednesday, the 1st day of July, 1857, at one o'clock, at the upset price affixed thereto, on the terms and conditions set forth in certain Land Regulations, dated 14th June, 1843:—

York Town Lot No 94—Comprising two (2) acres more or less. Upset price L.250.

On this lot of land, which comprises two building allotments, is erected a substantial dwelling house, with good farm buildings, including barn, stables, piggery, &c., good garden ground fenced in and a plentiful supply of water at all seasons of the year; this property is well known as the Homestead of the Gerald Farm at York.

Some land in the immediate neighborhood of these buildings, formerly comprising the Gerald Farm will shortly be laid out for purchase in suburban Lots.

NOTICE is hereby given that Australian Horses (entire, or geldings) to the extent in number of one hundred will be received by the Commissary General at Madras every year until further notice, commencing from the 1st January, 1857, upon the following terms.

The horses are required to be, not less than 4 nor more than 6 years old on delivery, and not under 14 hands 2 inches high.

Each horse must be free from vice, blemish, or any defect whatever which may constitute unsoundness of wind, limb, or vision, to be of good constitution, with free action, sufficient bone, general substance, and symmetry, to render him in every respect fit for Horse Artillery or European Dragoons, to be judged of by a Committee of officers at Madras.

The Horses will be at the risk of Government immediately upon being passed, by the committee which shall be assembled as soon as the owner of Horses may wish, but for no less a number than ten at a time except under particular circumstances.

The horses will be paid for after being passed by the Committee at the rate of Rupees 575 each.

HER Majesty's Secretary of State for the Colonies having been pleased to authorise His Excellency the Governor to announce that the payment of Passage Money will not in future be required from Ticket-of-Leave holders, and also to remit any outstanding arrears, under such regulations of detail, as he may deem proper under the circumstances.

His Excellency is pleased to direct that the date on which such payment shall be considered to have ceased, shall be the 28th FEBRUARY, 1857; and that all sums due up to that date, shall be required from Ticket-of-leave holders, prior to their receiving their Conditional Pardons, except in those cases in which he may be recommended by the Comptroller General of Convicts to remit the same.

All Ticket-of-Leave holders who have paid more than would have become due on the 28th February, 1857, at the rate of £5 per annum will have such over payment refunded to them on application to the Commissariat in the District to which they belonged at the above date; where there is no Commissariat, as at Toodyay, York, Port Gregory, and Champion Bay, the sums will be repaid by the Comptroller General through the Resident Magistrate and vouchers forwarded for signature at the time of payment.
