By His Excellency ARTHUR EDWARD KENNEDY, Esq., Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same.

IN pursuance of the authority in me vested by a certain Act of the Imperial Parliament of Great Britain and Ireland, passed in the 5th and 6th years of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act for regulating the sale of Waste Lands belonging to the Crown in the Australian Colonies," I do hereby notify and proclaim, that the following portion of Land will be offered for sale by public auction, by the Collector of Revenue at Perth, on Wednesday, the 1st day of July, 1857, at one o'clock, at the upset price affixed thereto, on the terms and conditions set forth in certain Land Regulations, dated 14th June, 1843:—

York Town Lot No. 94.—Comprising two (2) acres more or less. Upset price L.250.

On this lot of land which comprises two building allotments, is erected a substantial dwelling house with good farm buildings, including barn, stables, piggery, &c, good garden ground fenced in and a plentiful supply of water at all seasons of the year; this property if well known as the Homestead of the Gerald Farm at York.

Some land in the immediate neighbourhood of these buildings, formerly comprising the Gerald Farm will shortly be laid out for purchase in suburban Lots.

Proclamation.

By His Excellency ARTHUR EDWARD KENNEDY, Esq., Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same.

WHEREAS by the Passengers Act, 1855, (18th and 19th Vic. Cap. 119.) "To amend the law relating to the carriage of Passengers by sea." it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor of each of Her Majesty's Possessions abroad, by any Proclamation to be by him from time to time issued for that purpose (which shall take effect from the issuing thereof,) to declare what shall be deemed for the purposes of the said act to be the length of the voyage of any ship carrying Passengers from such Possessions to any other place whatsoever, and to prescribe such scale of Diet for the use of the Passengers during the voyage as he shall think proper, and also to declare what Medicines, Medical comforts, Medical Instruments, and other matters

shall be deemed necessary for the medical treatment of the Passengers during such Colonial Voyages: Now, therefore, I, Arthur Edward Kennedy, Governor, aforesaid, do declare that the following shall be the rule of computation, by which the length of the voyage of any ship, carrying Passengers from Western Australia to the several places hereinafter enumerated, shall be computed for the purposes of the said recited act, that is to say—

And I, the said Governor, do further declare that, in addition to, and irrespective of any Provisions of their own, which any Passenger may have on board, the Master of every such ship shall make to each Passenger during the voyage, including the time of detention, if any, at any Port or place, before the termination of such voyage, issues of pure Water and sweet and wholesome Provisions, in such quantities and of the same quality as those provided to be issued by the XXXV clause of the Passengers Act, 1855; and, lastly, I the said Governor, do hereby declare that the Medicines and Medical Instruments necessary for the Medical treatment of the Passengers on any such Colonial voyage shall be provided in such quantities, and of such quality, as the Medical Officer at the Port of clearance shall have deemed, and declared to be necessary for the particular voyage, and a certificate in writing to that effect shall have been executed by such Medical Officer, obtained by the Master, and by him, or some person on his behalf, presented to the Emigration Agent, prior to the vessel being cleared.

Medical Comforts shall be provided according to the following scale:—

For every 50 Statute Adults, and in like proportion for any greater or less number,
 Brandy, 4 bottles
 Sherry, 6 do
 Port Wine, 18 do.
 Porter, 36 do.
 Rice, 14lbs.
 Lime juice, 30 gallons
 Vinegar, 2½ do.
 Soap, Marine, 1½ cwt.
 Sugar, 200lbs.
 Oatmeal, prepared, 5lbs.

West Indian Arrowroot, 12lbs.
 Scotch Barley, 12lbs.
 Sago, 20lbs.
 Preserved Meats, 12lbs.
 Preserved Meat Soup, 12lbs.
 Preserved Milk, 5 doz. pints
 Tapioca, 7½
 Preserved broth in 1lb tins, 12lbs.

And I, the said Governor, do further declare that that portion of the Passengers Act of 1855, having particular reference to short Colonial voyages, shall from and after this date be in operation, and that independent of any Provisions of their own, the Master of every Passenger ship shall during the voyage, including the time of detention at any Port or place, before the termination thereof, issue to each Passenger an allowance of pure Water and sweet and wholesome Provisions, according to the following scale, viz. —

Water,
 Three quarts per diem to each Statute Adult, half that quantity for Children under 12 years of age, 10 gallons per diem for cooking for every one hundred Statute Adults.
 Weekly Dietary scale for Colonial Voyages under 21 days—
 Bread or Biscuit, 7lbs.
 Beef or Pork, 7lbs,
 Potatoes or Rice, 7lbs.
 Tea, 3½ ozs.
 Sugar, 1lb.
 Salt, 2 ozs.
 Vinegar, 1 gill.

Also that the 86th section of the Act will be strictly enforced, and that the survey and examination of Passenger Ships therein provided for shall be conducted by the Harbour Master in conjunction with some competent shipwright or shipwrights at the expense of the Owner or Charterer. The survey shall be made before any portion of the cargo is taken on board.

And, lastly, I do hereby rescind and annul all former Proclamations at any time, heretofore made in relation to the carriage of Passengers by sea from Western Australia aforesaid.

TENDERS (in duplicate) endorsed "Tenders for a Boat," will be received at this Office until Noon of Thursday, 18th instant, from persons willing to construct a Five Oared Whale Boat for the Pilot Service, according to the following specification, viz:—

The Boat to be clincher built
Length over all, 28 feet
Breadth (extreme), 5 ft. 10 in.
Depth, 2 ft. 2 in.

Keel, stem, sternpost, and gunwales to be mahogany

Keel to be 3 inches in depth clear of garboard streak

Stem to have less rake and more fore grip, than the usual Whaleboat

Stern-post to be straight, with rudder and tiller

Planking, thwarts, rising, and lining, to be pine or Singapore cedar, of good quality free from knots and rents

Floors to be placed between every two timbers, close lining up to rising, mast

step to be fitted, mast thwarts to be double kneed, 3½ inch hole for foremast, 3 inch hole for main-mast, all thwarts to be dovetailed into rising

Hoisting straps to be provided and placed as hereafter directed

Iron crutches, tack and sheet hooks, to be fitted fore and aft

The Boat to be built according to the model of the one in use by the Harbor Master, Contractor to take moulds of the same

Bilge piece to be fitted to save the lands in hauling up and launching

The Boat to be copper-fastened throughout, and the whole to be covered with two coats of lead colored paint.

For further particulars application to be made to the Harbor Master, who will inspect the work from time to time, and to whose approval the boat will be subjected on completion.

Tenders to state the time in which such boat can be completed.

A Bill for narrowing Essex Street in the Town of Fremantle, and for extending the limits of certain Building Lots in that Town.

A Bill to declare the legal operation of Land Grants made to deceased persons.

A Bill for the further appropriation of the Revenue for the year 1858, and for the general appropriation of the Revenue for the year 1858.

A Bill to consolidate and amend the laws relating to trespass by cattle and other live stock, and to promote the construction of fences.

A Bill to amend the "Public House Ordinance 1856."

A Bill to declare the Law respecting General and District Trustees of Church property, and to remove doubts respecting them.

A Bill to empower the Trustees of Church Property in Western Australia, to raise loans of money on the security of Glebe land in aid of the erection of Parsonage Houses.
