An Act for preventing Frauds upon Creditors by Secret Bills of Sale of personal Chattels

A Bill for vesting all Estates and Property occupied by or for the Naval Service of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland in the Lord High Admiral, or the Commissioners for executing the office of Lord High Admiral of the said United Kingdom for the time being.

A Bill to facilitate the Execution of Public Works throughout the Colony.

A Bill to confirm the Expenditure for the Services of the year 1862 beyond the Grant for that year.

A Bill for the General Appropriation of the Revenue for the year 1864.

A Bill to encourage the making of Wine in Western Australia, by permitting Distillation of the Fermented Juice of the Grape and produce of the Vine, under certain restrictions.

A Bill for the recovery of Small Debts in Western Australia.

A Bill to regulate Divorce and Matrimonial Causes.

### ROCK IN BASS, STRAITS.

A rock awash having been reported to exist in Bass' Straits, about five or six miles to the E. N.E. of the Crocodile Rock, search for which has hitherto been unsuccessful, navigators are cautioned to keep a good look-out when in the neighborhood of its assigned position.

The undermentioned bearings have been given as the position of this supposed danger:—  
Devil's Tower, E. by S.  $\frac{1}{2}$  S. distant four miles.  
Curtis Island, S.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E.  
Rodondo Island, W.N.W.

Crocodile, W.S.W., distant between five and six miles.  
The westernmost of the Moncœurs Islands, just on with the westernmost land of Wilson's Promontory.
