THE following Titles of Bills proposed to be submitted to the Legislative Council at its next Sessions are published for general information.

A Bill to amend the Laws respecting Inquiries in the nature of Coroners' Inquests.

A Bill for securing to Edward J Crease for a limited period the exclusive benefit of a certain Invention.

A Bill to extend the Jurisdiction of the Police and Resident Magistrates.

A Bill to grant facilities for depositing Small Savings at Interest, with the Security of the Government for Repayment thereof.

A Bill for the Regulation of Benefit Building Societies.

A Bill to regulate Friendly Societies.

A Bill to compel River Steam Vessels to carry a Boat.

A Bill to amend the "Colonial Passengers' Ordinance, 1861."

A Bill for preventing Frauds upon Creditors by Secret Bills of Sale of personal Chattels

A Bill for vesting all Estates and Property occupied by or for the Naval Service of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland in the Lord High Admiral, or the Commissioners for executing the office of Lord High Admiral of the said United Kingdom for the time being.

A Bill to facilitate the Execution of Public Works throughout the Colony.

A Bill to confirm the Expenditure for the Services of the year 1862 beyond the Grant for that year.

A Bill to encourage the Cultivation of the Vine by permitting Distillation of the produce thereof, under certain restrictions.

HIS Excellency the Governor has been pleased to direct that from and after this date the names and trades of all Probation Prisoners will be published in the Government Gazette as they become eligible for discharge upon Ticket-of-Leave, and no Probation Prisoner will in future be released on Ticket-of-Leave until he is either hired into private service, or can shew satisfactorily that he has the means of earning his own livelihood.

The gratuity of all such Prisoners will cease from the dates on which they are respectively gazetted as eligible for Ticket-of-Leave.

So long as the Prisoners are maintained by the Government they will be employed on the Public Works, and will be allowed tobacco under Issue in kind No. 237.
