**I**T is hereby notified for the information of the Public that on and after the 1st of September next, Post Office Savings Banks will be opened at the undermentioned Post Offices:—

Perth  
Fremantle  
Guildford  
York  
Newcastle  
Bunbury  
Vasse  
Albany  
Champion Bay  
Pinjarrah

These Banks will be open for the receipt and repayment of deposits on every working day from nine in the morning till four in the evening.

In these Banks deposits may be made to the amount of one shilling or any number of shillings, or of Pounds and shillings, provided the deposits do not amount to more than £30 in any one year.

When the first deposit is made the Depositor will receive a numbered Book in which his name, address and occupation and the date and amount of his deposit will be entered.

On the day on which the deposit is made the Postmaster must report to the Post Master General that he has received the money from the Depositor and in two or three days afterwards he will receive a printed letter from the General Post Office to inform him that his deposit has been duly reported;—If the depositor do not receive such a letter within ten days from the day on which he made his deposit, he must write to the Post Master General for it.

Any Depositor wishing to withdraw money which he has deposited, can apply to the nearest Post Office Savings Bank for a printed form of application.—He must fill up the form in the manner pointed out in the printed Regulations, and send the application to the General Post Office, Perth.—By the return Mail he will receive a Warrant from Perth which will enable him to receive his money at the Post Office named by him.

While the money of any Depositor lies in the Post Office Savings Bank, he will be allowed interest on it at the rate of Three Pounds Fifteen Shillings per annum for every Hundred Pounds, that is, he will receive nine pence a year or three farthings a month for every complete Pound which he may deposit.

Parents may deposit for their children and women whether married or single may deposit on their own account.

Depositors will not have to pay the postage of any letters which they may write to or receive from the General Post Office with respect to their deposits.

The Post Masters are forbidden to disclose the names of Depositors or the amounts they may deposit, to any one but the Post Master General or to any other officer duly authorised by the Government.

NOTICE.

**O**N and after the 1st June, 1863, a FLOATING LIGHT-SHIP will be moored *inside the Little Basses Reef*:—The centre of Rocks bearing S. b. W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W., distant about one-third of a mile.

It will exhibit a FLASHING LIGHT between the hours of sunset and sunrise, at intervals of one minute and a half.

It is 33 feet above the Sea, and from the horizon dips at 7 miles; to a ship within that distance, in fine weather, it does not entirely disappear; and is visible 11 miles from a ship's deck of 18 feet elevation.

**H**IS Excellency the Governor has been pleased to direct that from and after this date the names and trades of all Probation Prisoners will be published in the Government Gazette as they become eligible for discharge upon Ticket-of-Leave, and no Probation Prisoner will in future be released on Ticket-of-Leave until he is either hired into private service, or can shew satisfactorily that he has the means of earning his own livelihood.

The gratuity of all such Prisoners will cease from the dates on which they are respectively gazetted as eligible for Ticket-of-Leave.
