THE Board appointed by His Excellency the Governor, for the purpose of Licensing Boats, and Boatmen, for the year 1864, will assemble at the Court House, Fremantle, on Thursday, the 31st of December inst., at 11 o'clock in the forenoon; also on Thursday, the 15th of January, 1864, at the same hour.

Owners of Boats and Flats in Perth, and Fremantle, will have their Boats ready for inspection at the North or South Jetties, betwixt the hours of ten and twelve on the respective Licensing days.

Names and numbers to be painted upon Boats, before submitted to the inspection of the Board.

Boatmen applying for Licenses under the Act, will come prepared with such certificates of character and competency as they may be able to obtain.

All parties found working Boats without a License after the above mentioned Licensing days, will be fined according to Act of Council.

Cart Licenses will also be granted on the same days.
