SIR,

With reference to my Despatch No. 59 of the 24th June, 1864, I have the honor to report that in consequence of the abandonment of Camden Harbor and the approaching transfer of the Government Establishment to some other portion of the North Coast, it seems very desirable that the period of twelve months for which you have approved the sale of land in the North District at 7s. 6d. an acre should be extended.

2. The selection of land in fee will, practically, only commence on the formation of the new Government Settlement, in the vicinity of which the first purchases will probably be made, and I would therefore request your authority for extending the time during which sales may be made, as explained in the first Section of the Regulations, copy herewith, to a further period of twelve months from the 17th January next.
