Notice to Postmasters and the Public.

*General Post Office,
Perth, 15th May, 1866.*

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that an alteration has been made in the regulation for charging Packets of Books and Patterns transmitted by the Post to the United Kingdom, by substituting for the scale of progression hitherto used (under which two rates of postage

were charged for every half-pound after the first half-pound,) a scale progressing throughout by a single rate of postage for every weight of four ounces: thus charging for a packet *vid* Southampton, weighing not more than 4oz. 4d.
Above 4oz. but not exceeding 8oz. 8d.
Above 8oz. but not exceeding 12oz., 1s 0d.
Above 12oz. but not exceeding 16oz., 1s 4d. and so on.

And for packets *vid* Marseilles, double the above rates.
