**T**ENDERS (in duplicate,) endorsed "Tenders for the Conveyance of the Albany Mail," will be received at this Office up to noon of Monday, the 19th November next, for the conveyance of Colonial and Foreign Mails between Perth and Albany, for three years, commencing on the 1st January, 1867.

Tenders to embrace the following points:—

- 1 For conveyance of a Monthly Mail from Perth to Albany, and *vice versa*, at per month.
- 2 For conveyance of Express Mails from Albany to Perth, at any time during the month (on being called upon to do so by the Postmaster at Albany), at per trip ;  
and
- 3 For conveyance of a bi-monthly Mail from Perth to Albany, and *vice versa*, at per trip.

It is not intended to adopt the service named in No. 3 paragraph, unless bi-monthly steam communication between England and the Australian Colonies is

established, but in such event the accepted tender for a bi-monthly mail would be put into operation.

The Contractor to convey the Mails at such dates in each month as the Postmaster General shall fix.

Parties tendering to state the time in which they will undertake to convey the Mails between Perth and Albany, and *vice versa*.

The tender stipulating to convey the Mail in the shortest time between the two places, will be preferably considered.

In case the Contractor should fail to deliver the Mails at either Perth or Albany within his contract time, in consequence of the overloading of the Mail Cart with Passengers or Luggage, &c., he will be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20, exclusive of any sum recoverable by his bond.

In the event of the Mail Packets discontinuing to touch at King George's Sound during the period of the contract, the unexpired portion of it to be cancelled.

The arrival and departure of the Mail will be subject to instructions from the Postmaster General, and liable to alteration at any time during the contract.

The Contractor will be required to provide an Officer of the Post Office with a free passage to and from Albany, if called upon to do so at any time by the Postmaster General.

Two approved sureties will be required to join the contractor in a guarantee for the due fulfilment of the duties contracted to be performed.

No payment will be made on account of the contract until the bond shall have been signed by the Contractor and his Sureties, and any breach of contract in the wilful or negligent departure of the Mail at the appointed days and hours will subject the contractor to the loss of a proportionate part of his monthly pay, or the cancellation of his contract.

The Contractor is to convey and deliver all Mails which may be intrusted to him under the authority of the Postmaster General, or the Postmaster at Albany, and to provide secure and water tight lockers for the Mails, and covering for the same. He will moreover be bound not to convey, or permit his servants to convey, any letter or packet to the prejudice of the Post Office Revenue under a penalty of £3 for each offence, which penalty will be deducted from his monthly pay.

The persons employed by the contractor to convey the mail are to be subject to the approval of the Postmaster General, both as to age and character.

The Contractors are to convey and deliver all Mails which may be entrusted to them under the authority of the Postmaster General or any of the Postmasters, and to provide secure and water tight lockers for Mails where carts are used, and coverings for bags on horseback. The Contractors moreover will be bound not

to convey, nor to permit their servants to convey, any letter or packet to the prejudice of the Post Office Revenue, under a penalty of £3 which penalty will be deducted from their monthly pay.

### Road between Albany and the Kalgan River Ferry, &c.

IT is hereby notified for general information, that it is the intention of the Government to lay out, clear and make, as soon as convenient, a line of road between the Town of Albany and the present road to Jerramungup, by way of the mouth of King River and the Kalgan River Ferry, with a view to the same being opened for use as a public line of communication, pursuant to the provisions of existing Ordinances:—

The road will be half a chain in width and, commencing at the east end of North Street in Albany, will extend eastward on the north side of Craggy Bluff to the south corner of Plantagenet location 43, then inside the northern boundary of Albany Townsite, and north north-eastward to the bridge over Yakama Brook, thence north-eastward along the ridges to the middle of the west boundary of location 7, and thence more easterly to Point Henty at the mouth of King River. Crossing the ford there, the road will extend to the NW corner of location 28, then outside its north boundary and through location 21 to the ferry across Kalgan River.—Crossing at the said ferry, the road will run through the SE corner of locations 51, 53, and 5, and then north-easterly to the present road which extends eastward from the Windham Brige across the Kalgan.

The above road will pass as near as may be found desirable along the tracks at present in use; and all persons are warned against fencing across or otherwise obstructing the said tracks, until the permanent lines may be finally laid out and cleared.
