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PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency John Stephen Hampton, Esquire, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same.

WHEREAS the undermentioned Ordinances were passed by me the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council of the said Colony, in the 30th Year of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, and respectively intituled:—

- No. 1.—“ An Ordinance to prevent doubts as to the application of the Statutes of Usury and to limit and define the Rates of Interest which may be recovered in cases where it hath not been previously agreed on between the parties.”  
2nd July, 1866.
- No. 4.—“ An Ordinance for securing to John Morgan for a limited period the exclusive benefit of a certain Invention.”  
9th July, 1866.
- No. 5.—“ An Ordinance to give a preferable lien on Wool from season to season, and to render Mortgages of Sheep, Cattle, and Horses valid, without delivery to the Mortgagee.”  
9th July, 1866.
- No. 6.—“ An Ordinance to amend the Ordinances relating to trespasses by Live Stock.”  
9th July, 1866.

NOW THEREFORE I, the said Governor, do hereby proclaim and make known to all whom it may concern, that Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to confirm and allow the same.

REGULATIONS  
UNDER WHICH  
UNMANUFACTURED TOBACCO

IS TO BE

Admitted into the Colony  
At the REDUCED DUTY of 3d. per lb.

1. On and after the 1st January, 1867, unmanufactured tobacco, rendered unfit for human consumption by the admixture of Oil of Turpentine, Oil of Tar, Kerosene, or some other substance to be approved of by the Collector or a Sub-Collector of Customs, will be cleared from bond and admitted into the Colony at a duty of three pence per lb.

2. An Owner of Tobacco wishing to have the same rendered unfit for human consumption must make application to the Collector or Sub-Collector at any Port, at least one week prior to delivery of the same, in the form hereunto appended, or such other form or forms as may be prescribed from time to time by the Collector of Customs.

3. No application will be entertained for rendering unfit for human consumption a portion of any package of Tobacco, and no such portion of a package can be entered for duty—whole packages alone must be entered at one time, and till entered, will be liable for the same rate of warehouse rent as when originally bonded.

4. Proper Cases or Casks (to be approved of by the Collector or Sub-Collector of Customs) to be provided by and at the expense of the applicant.

5. At present it is proposed to mix not less than One gallon of Oil of Tar or other substance to One hundred pounds of Tobacco (and so in proportion for larger or smaller quantities) which must be supplied by and at the expense of the applicant.

6. Tobacco thus rendered unfit for human consumption will not be forwarded from one port to another under bond.

7. A charge at the rate of 1s. 6d. per 100 lbs. will be levied for the expense of the labour and supervision employed in rendering unfit for human consumption Tobacco in bond.

8. Any person having Tobacco in bond, and making application for the same to be rendered unfit for human consumption, may depute an Agent to witness the operation.
