PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency John Stephen Hampton, Esquire, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same.

IN PURSUANCE of the authority in me vested by the 16th Section of an Ordinance passed in the 19th Year of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, No. 15. intituled "An Ordinance to consolidate and amend the Laws respecting "the Licensing of Boats and Boatmen," I do hereby notify and proclaim that the Regulations hereunto annexed are and shall be Regulations to be observed by persons using the Bridge over the River Swan at Fremantle, until altered or amended as occasion may require.

GOD SAVE THE QUEEN !!!

Regulations to be observed by persons
using the Bridge over the River Swan at
Fremantle.

1.—There shall not be on the North Fremantle Bridge at one and the same

time a number of horned Cattle, not being milch Cows, exceeding ten.

2.—No Cattle, save Milch Cows, and draught Oxen, shall be driven over the said Bridge excepting between the hours of ten at night and eight in the morning.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency John Stephen Hampton, Esquire, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same.

WHEREAS the undermentioned Ordinances were passed by me the said Governor with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council of the said Colony in the 30th Year of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, and respectively intituled:—

No. 7.—"An Ordinance to confirm the Expenditure for the Services of the year One thousand Eight hundred and Sixty-five, beyond the grant for that year."

9th July, 1866.

No. 8.—"An Ordinance to appropriate the sum of Eighty-two thousand and Forty-five pounds out of the General Revenue of the Colony, for the Service of the year One thousand Eight hundred and Sixty-seven."

9th July 1866.

No. 13.—"An Ordinance for the prevention and cure of Scab in Sheep."

17th December, 1866.

No. 14.—"An Ordinance to reduce the Duty on the importation of un-manufactured Tobacco."

17th December, 1866.

NOW THEREFORE I, the said Governor, do hereby proclaim and make known to all whom it may concern, that Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to confirm and allow the same.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

A Lighthouse has been erected on the Bluff, at the south side of the entrance of Port Natal, at an elevation of 292 feet above high water, a light from which will be exhibited on the 23rd January, 1867.

The Lighthouse is in Latitude 29° 52' 50" S., and Longitude 31° 3' 35" E.

The building is an iron tower, in the form of a frustrum of a cone, 81 feet high, painted white; centre of light being 70 feet above the base, exhibiting a revolving white light of the second class (dioptric), attaining its greatest brilliancy once every minute.

It is visible in all directions from North (round by East and South), to S. 59° W.; and can be seen from a ship's deck 24 miles in clear weather.

The above light is not visible from the Aliwal Shoal, which is 25 miles S., 53° W.; from the Lighthouse: vessels should not, therefore, when coming from the south-

ward and westward, approach the shore nearer than 4 miles, or shoal their water under 40 fathoms, using the lead freely until they make the light well out from the deck, when they may stand in until it bears N 59° E.—which bearing will keep them outside all known danger—until they are abreast of the Umlazi River (about 9½ miles below the Lighthouse), when they must keep it more to the northward, as the land trends more to the eastward, giving the shore a good birth of a mile, and when the light bears about N.N.W., they can haul into the northward for the anchorage: anchoring in 8½ to 10 fathoms, with the Lighthouse bearing S.W. to S.W.½S., distant 1 mile.
