PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency John Stephen Hampton, Esquire, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies and Vice-Admiral of the same.

IN pursuance of the Authority vested in me by an Ordinance passed in the Third year of the Reign of His Majesty King William the Fourth, No. 1, intituled An Act to enforce and regulate the performance of Quarantine in certain cases in Western Australia,—I do hereby, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, notify, proclaim, and order that all Persons, Vessels, and Boats are hereby prohibited from going under any pretence whatever, within the following limits of the the Station which has been assigned by My Order, with the advice aforesaid, for the performane of Quarantine by the “*Sea Nymph*” found to have an infectious disease on board.

QUARANTINE LIMITS.

Within One mile Eastward of Garden Island, and to the North of a line between the summit of Garden Island and the summit of Brown Hill.

QUARANTINE ORDER.

*Colonial Secretary's Office,
Perth, 1st June, 1867.*

HIS Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the Ordinance 3rd William 4th No. 1. of 1833, and in furtherance of the Report of the Health Officer at the Port of Fremantle, doth hereby Order that the “*Sea Nymph*” lately arrived in such Port from the Mauritius, with an infectious disease on board, as it is reported by such Health Officer, with the persons, goods, wares and merchandize, and other articles on board thereof at the time she was ordered into quarantine by such Health Officer, do continue in quarantine during *twenty-one* days from the 30th day of May, last past, at Garden Island within one mile eastward of Garden Island, and to the north of a line between the summit of Garden Island and the summit of Brown Hill; and all persons so being on board thereof shall not quit such vessel without the license of the Governor; nor shall any of such goods and other articles as aforesaid be removed therefrom during such period of quarantine. And the said Governor doth further Order that all such goods, wares, merchandize and other articles so ordered to continue in quarantine shall be opened and aired.
