SIR,

With reference to my Despatch of the 1st of May, apprising you of the probability that H. M. S. "Galatea" under the command of His Royal Highness the Duke of Edinburgh would visit the Colony under your Government, I think it desirable that you should receive some instructions for your guidance as to His Royal Highness's reception.

The Duke of Edinburgh on his first arrival in a British Colony or Settlement, and on his final departure from it, but not upon other occasions, should have all the usual and proper honors paid to him by way of Salutes, guards of honor and other public marks of respect as a Member of the Royal Family.

His Royal Highness will receive addresses and make replies to them, and take part in public ceremonies in cases which are suggested or approved by the Governor or Lieutenant Governor of the Colony or Settlement.
