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PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency John Stephen Hampton, Esquire, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same.

WHEREAS it is enacted by the second section of the "Small Debts Ordinance, 1863." that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time, and at any time by Proclamation published in the Western Australian Government Gazette, to constitute Local Courts for the recovery of Small Debts and Demands, to be holden at such times and places, and within such Districts throughout the said Colony as may be most fit and convenient, and as may be specified in such Proclamation, and likewise by Proclamation to alter the time or place or manner of holding any such Courts, and that it has been deemed expedient to alter as hereinafter specified the time for holding the Local Court at Greenough; NOW THEREFORE I, the said Governor, in exercise of such powers, do hereby notify and proclaim that from and after this date the Local Court at Greenough in the Victoria District shall be holden on the fourth Wednesday in each Month.

THE attention of Flock Owners is called to the thirtieth section of the "Scab in Sheep Ordinance of 1866," a compliance with which is imperative.

30. "Every Owner of Sheep depastured and kept in the Colony shall make to the Clerk to the Resident Magistrate for the District in which the said sheep are depastured, a Return on the First day of November, One thousand Eight hundred and Sixty seven, and on the First day of October in each succeeding year, or within fourteen days thereafter in each year, of all sheep so kept and depastured, and any Owner who shall fail to make such return at the time so appointed, shall incur for every such offence a penalty not exceeding Ten Pounds."
