For Europe, India, Cape of Good Hope, &c., on Thursday, the 5th January, at 4 o'clock p.m.

For the Australian Colonies, New Zealand, and Tasmania, on Saturday, the 7th January, at 4 o'clock p.m.

Money Orders for transmission by the above conveyance will be issued on the United Kingdom up to 11 o'clock a.m. on the 4th, and on the Australian Colonies, New Zealand, and Tasmania, up to 11 o'clock a.m. on the 6th January.

Letters for Registration must be posted one hour before the closing of the Mail. Late Letters, on payment of a fee of 6d., may be posted up to 5 o'clock p.m. for the European Mails, and up to 4:30 p.m. for the Colonial Mails.

Newspapers must be posted one hour before the closing of the Mail by which they are intended to be sent, otherwise they will not be forwarded until the next Mail.

NOTE.—Until further notice no Mails will be forwarded to London *via* *Marseilles*, but Mails will be despatched *via* *Brindisi*, the postage for which route is as follows:

For Letters, 1s. 1d. per half-ounce.

For Book Packets, &c., 7d. for every four ounces.

For Newspapers, 2d. each, and 1d. for every four ounces.
