IT is hereby notified, for general information, that under the provisions of "*An Act to establish Local Boards for the conservation, improvement, and making of Roads in the several Districts of the Colony*," His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to designate and define the following Districts as Road Districts under the Act, and to direct that the first Elections shall be held at the several places and dates hereunto annexed, and to appoint as Returning Officers the several persons whose names are affixed against each District:—

ROAD DISTRICTS.

No. 1.—MINES.

Bounded on the *North* by an East and West line from the mouth of the Murchison River; on the *West* by the sea coast; and on the *South* by an East and West line through Okajee.

No. 2.—GERALDTON.

Bounded on the *North* by the South boundary of the Mines District; on the *West* by the Sea Coast; on the *South* by a line from the mouth of the Greenough River to Wizard Peak, and then by a line running due East.

No. 3.—GREENOUGH.

Bounded on the *North* by the South boundary of Geraldton District; on the *West* by the Sea Coast; and on the *South* by a line from the Coast along Wakeford Road through Mount Hill, and thence due East.

No. 4.—IRWIN.

Bounded on the *North* by the South boundary of the Greenough District; on the *West* by the Sea Coast; and on the *South* by an East and West line through Carnamah Spring.

No. 5.—VICTORIA PLAINS.

Bounded on the *North* by the South boundary of the Irwin District; on the *West* by the Sea Coast; on the *South* by an East and West line from the Coast to Moore River Bridge, thence to Bindoon, thence to Bolgart, and due East.

No. 6.—SWAN.

Bounded on the *North* by the South boundary of Victoria Plains District; thence from Bindoon to N.W. corner of Baylup Reserve; thence to junction of Toodyay and Swan Roads near Blackadder Creek; then to junction of York Road including the Swan Road; thence in a South West direction, excluding the Townsite of Guildford, to junction of Perth and Guildford Road with West Boundary of Hardey's Location 33; thence to South-West corner of Swan Location X; thence by a line extending N. by W. to junction of the East boundary of Location 104 with Lake Gnangarra; thence by a North line; thence by a West line to the Sea Coast through the North end of Lake Nowergup; and on the *West* by the Sea Coast.

No. 7.—PERTH.

Bounded on the *North* and *East* by the boundaries of the Swan District; on the *South* by the River Swan from Location X to the sea, and on the *West* by the Sea Coast. To include the Perth and Guildford road to its junction with Swan District, inclusive of Perth Causeway.

No. 8.—TOODYAY.

Bounded on the *North* and *West* by Victoria Plains and Swan Districts from junction of Swan and Toodyay Roads near Blackadder Creek to S.E. corner of Warriloo; thence to South Boundary of Location 320; thence to Quelquelling; then by a due East line.

No. 9.—NORTHAM.

Bounded on the *North* by the South Boundary of Toodyay District; on the *West* by a line from S.E. corner of Warriloo to junction of York and Northam Roads; thence to Cunderdin Hill; thence a due East line.

No. 10.—YORK.

Bounded on the *North* by the Southern Boundary of Northam District, as far as the junction of York and Northam Roads; thence by a line to Warriloo; thence to junction of Swan and Toodyay Roads near Blackadder Creek; thence to junction of York Road, excluding the Swan Road; thence easterly to the old Half-way House; thence southerly to Mount Dale; thence to Boyagarring Hill; thence by a North easterly line from said Hill to South corner of Avon Location 30; thence by South Boundaries of Locations N & O; thence by the Avon River, downwards, by the North Boundary of Location H 2; thence by an East-North-Easterly line to Mount Stirling; thence due East.

No. 11.—CANNING.

Bounded on the *North* and *East* by the York District; on the *South* by a line from Mount Dale to S.W. corner of Kelmscott Townsite; thence by a line to Bull's Creek; thence following the Rivers Canning and Swan to S.W. corner of Swan District, exclusive of Perth and Guildford Road, to junction of Swan District.

No. 12.—FREMANTLE.

Bounded on the *North* by the River Swan from Fremantle to the Mouth of the Canning River; thence by S.W. Boundary of Canning District to S.E. corner of Kelmscott Townsite; then by a South-westerly line to Rockingham; on the *West* by the Sea Coast.

No. 13.—MURRAY.

Bounded on the *North* by the South Boundaries of Fremantle, Canning, and York Districts, to Boyagarring Hill; thence southerly to the junction of Wandering Brook with the Hotham River; thence South-easterly to Bannister Townsite; thence along, but not including, the Albany Road, to junction of Fawcett's Road; thence by a Westerly line to Mount Williams; thence due West to the Sea; on the *West* by the Sea Coast.

No. 14.—BEVERLEY.

Bounded on the *North* and *West* by the York and Murray Districts to Bannister Townsite; thence by a due East line.

No. 15.—WELLINGTON.

Bounded on the *North* by the South Boundary of the Murray District; on the *West* by the Sea Coast; on the *South* by a true East line from said Coast to Capel River, passing through the North end of Wonnerup Inlet; thence by said River upwards to Location 171, and by a South-easterly line from the South West Corner of that Location to junction of Padbury's Brook with the Blackwood River; thence South-easterly to Manjinup; thence East-North-easterly to North-West Corner of Kojonup Townsite; on the *East* by, but not including, the Albany Road.

No. 16.—SUSSEX.

Bounded on the *North* and *East* by the Wellington and Plantagenet Districts to Nornalup, and on all other sides by the Sea Coast.

No. 17.—PLANTAGENET.

Bounded on the *West* by a line from Nornalup to Manjinup; on the *North* by the South boundary of Wellington District; on the *East* by a South-Easterly line from Kojonup to Cape Riche; thence by the Sea Coast to Nornalup.

No. 18.—NICOL BAY.

All that portion North of a due East and West line from the mouth of the Murchison River,

Swan Spit Shoal.

REFERRING to a notice, dated the 6th instant,* masters, pilots, and others are hereby informed that a black buoy has been placed in twenty-one (21) feet water at the S.E. end of the shoal which has recently formed to the eastward of the Swan Spit.

The following bearings mark the position of the buoy, viz. :—

High light at Shortland's Bluff in line with the west end of Swan Spit Light S. W. by W.

No. 12 Perch Buoy just open to the eastward of the West Channel Lightship (swung to the ebb). Swan Beacon W. 4 N.

The shoal which has irregular soundings from thirteen to seventeen feet lies N.N.W. about one cable length from the buoy and is about half a cable in width, having twenty-two feet water at its outer or eastern edge.

New Lights for Lady Bay.

Notice is hereby given that on or about the first day of May, 1871, it is intended, with a view to facilitate the navigation into Lady Bay, to remove the present lighthouse from Middle Island and to exhibit two fixed leading lights at the sites of the present obelisks, which stand on a ridge of hills immediately in front of the town of Warrnambool.

The upper light will be a fixed white light and will be shown from a tower 109 feet above the level of the sea, and will be visible at a distance of fourteen (14) miles.

The lower light will be shown from the top of the present lower obelisk and will exhibit a fixed red and white light. It will be 87 feet above the level of the sea.

The two lights in line bearing by compass N. 4 E. will lead through the best water, between the five-fathoms' bank and the foul ground to the north-westward.
