WHEREAS, by the Lunacy Act, 1871, it is enacted that the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, may from time to time by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare any place or places provided or deemed suitable for the purpose to be an Asylum for Lunatics;

NOW THEREFORE I, the said Governor, do, with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby notify and Proclaim that the Buildings and appurtenances thereto belonging, situate in Fremantle, and now and heretofore used as a Lunatic Asylum, shall henceforth be used as an Asylum for the reception of Lunatics under the provisions of the said Act.

Given under my Hand and issued under the Public Seal of the said Colony, at Government House, Perth, this fourteenth day of March, in the Year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, and in the thirty-fourth Year of the reign of Her Majesty the Queen.
