THE following By-Laws for regulating the proceedings of the Perth Municipal Council, have been confirmed by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of his Executive Council.

Resolved—That in accordance with the 28th Section of “The Municipal Institutions’ Act, 1871,” the following By-Laws be now adopted by the Perth City Council, for the regulation, management, and control of the several matters and things therein set forth, viz.:—

1. The Perth City Council shall meet in the Town Hall, for the transaction of business, on the first Friday in every month, or oftener if necessary.

2. The Supervisor, for the time being, shall have the immediate custody, care, management, and direction, under instructions from the Council, of all Buildings, Fairs, Streets, Paths, Jetties, Wharves, Trees, Plants, Posts, Fences, Works, Drains, Culverts, and other property belonging to, or in charge of the City Council, and shall be answerable for the preservation and due care of the same.

3. The Collector for the time being, appointed by the Council, shall have the necessary legal power and authority to demand and collect all Rates, Assessments, License fees, Fines, Forfeitures, Tolls, and other sums due to the Council, and his receipt shall be a full and sufficient discharge for the same. And all sums so collected shall be lodged in the Bank, to the credit of the City Treasurer, at least once a week, under a penalty of any sum not exceeding £20.

4. Any person who shall keep or use a Carriage, Car, Cart, Waggon, or other Vehicle within the boundaries of the City for seven days, without having obtained a License, to be signed by the Chairman of the Council, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding £10.

5. Any person who shall keep or use any vehicle in the course of trade or for hire, within the boundaries of the city, without having the owner’s name and the licensed number painted thereon, in letters not less than one inch in length, in some conspicuous place on the off side of such vehicle, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding £5.

Carriages or Carts belonging to Government, the Governor, or a Minister of religion, and used in the course of his religious duties, shall be free.

6. Any person who shall keep a horse for the saddle (and who shall not have a Carriage or Cart License) within the boundary of the City for 7 days, without having obtained a License signed by the Chairman, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding £5.

Horses belonging to the Government, the Governor, or Ministers of religion, shall be free.

7. Any person who shall keep for 7 days within the boundary of the city, and depasture the same on City or Crown lands, any Cattle, Sheep, or Goats, without having obtained a License, signed by the Chairman of the Council, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding £2 10s.

SCHEDULE OF FEES FOR CATTLE LICENSE.

1. For every head of cattle above 12 months old 5s. per annum.
 2. For all Sheep or Goats at the rate of 2s. 6d. per score per annum.
8. Any person who shall keep for 7 days within the boundary of the City a Dog above the age of six months, without having obtained a License signed by the Chairman, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding £5.

SCHEDULE OF FEES FOR DOG LICENSE.

1. For every Dog above the age of 6 months 7s. 6d. per annum.

9. Any owner or master of any Boat, Flat, or other vessel employed in carrying cargo to or from any Wharf or Jetty belonging to, or in charge of the City Council, who shall neglect for 7 days to pay to the Collector or Treasurer of the Council, Tolls or Dues according to the following Schedule, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding £5.

SCHEDULE OF TOLLS OR DUES FOR ALL CARGO PLACED UPON ANY WHARF OR JETTY BELONGING TO, OR IN CHARGE OF, THE CITY COUNCIL:—

1. For every ton of imported Merchandise ... 6d.
 2. For every ton of Sandalwood 3d.
 3. For every bale of Wool 2d.
 4. For every 1000 bricks 6d.
 5. For every yard of Stone 1d.
 6. For every cord of Firewood 2d.
 7. For all other Goods per ton 3d.
- Goods or Stores belonging to Government, the Governor, or the City Council, and Immigrants' Luggage shall be free.
10. Any owner or master of any Boat, Flat, or other vessel, who shall neglect for 7 days, after the end of each month, to furnish the Chairman of the City Council with a statement (or who shall knowingly send in a false one) of the quantity of Merchandise and other goods taken on board, or landed from such Boat or Vessel, on or from any Jetty or Wharf belonging to or in charge of the City Council, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding £10.

11. Any person keeping or using a slaughter house, or who shall slaughter or cause to be slaughtered any Cattle, Sheep, Swine, or Goats, within three miles of the external boundaries of the City of Perth, without having obtained a License signed by the Chairman of the Council, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding £10.

SCALE OF FEES FOR LICENSE FOR SLAUGHTERING CATTLE, &c.

1. For each Bull, Cow, Heifer, or Steer ... 2s. 6d.
 2. For each Calf 1s.
 3. For each Sheep or Goat 3d.
 4. For each Pig 1s. 6d.
- This is not to extend to persons killing for their own use.
12. Any person keeping or using a slaughter-house, or who shall slaughter or cause to be slaughtered any Cattle, Sheep, Swine, or Goats within three miles of the external boundaries of the City, who shall neglect for 7 days after the end of each month to furnish the Chairman with the number of Cattle, etc., so slaughtered, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding £5.

13. Any person who shall herd Cattle within the jurisdiction of the Perth City Council, and who shall neglect to furnish the Chairman with a correct quarterly statement of the number of Cattle in his herd, and their owners' names, shall forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding £5.

14. All Licenses issued by the Chairman of

the City Council shall continue in force till the 31st December in each year, and no License shall be issued for a less period than six months.

15. Any person who shall (without first having obtained the written sanction of the Chairman of the City Council) cut down, damage, destroy, or injure any Tree, Plant, Post, Fence, Gate, Drain, Water-course, Culvert, Jetty, Wharf, Building, or other property belonging to or in charge of the Council, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding £10.

16. Any person who shall in the course of trade or business, within the boundaries of the City, use any false weights or measures, or who shall sell any unlawfully-adulterated spirituous or fermented liquors, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding £10.

17. Any person who shall sell or offer for sale, within the boundaries of the City, any Meat, Fish, or Vegetables, unfit for human food, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding £5.

18. Any owner or occupier of any land, house, or premises, within the City boundary, who shall neglect or refuse for fourteen days after due notice from the Inspector of Nuisances or the Chairman of the Council, to abate or remove all nuisances which are or shall arise thereon, or to remove any inflammable building, or pile or stack of wood, or other material dangerous to the adjoining or contiguous property, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding £10.

19. Any owner or other person who shall wilfully or negligently allow any horse or other live stock to stray or be at large without a keeper within the City boundary, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence the following Fine, in addition to Pound fees and damage by trespass:—

20. Any owner or occupier of any House, Shop, Store, or other building within the City boundaries, whose roof shall overhang or project over any thoroughfare or footway without having a proper gutter and pipe to carry off the rain, or who shall construct or have any Cornice, Crane, Hoist, or other fixture or projection overhanging any footway or thoroughfare, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding £5 for every month such nuisance shall remain after fourteen days' notice to remove the same shall have been given in writing by the Inspector of Nuisances, or the Chairman of the City Council.

21. It being advisable, for the health of the inhabitants and the improvement of the City, that the Council should make special provision for draining certain portions of land within the City boundaries, it is hereby declared lawful for the City Council to effect such drainage out of the general revenue of the City in the first instance, and to levy a special assessment on the property in such localities, in proportion to their value and interest in such improvements, to the full amount of such expenditure—which special assessment shall be in addition to any general rate or assessment authorised by "The Municipal Institutions' Act, 1871."
