Remissions to Military and  
Naval Officers.

IT is hereby notified, for the information of Military and Naval Officers who may henceforth receive Remission Certificates in the purchase of Waste Crown Lands in Western Australia, that the full title to land purchased with any such Certificate will not be granted until the officer claiming the same shall have shown to the satisfaction of the Governor that he has resided personally on the land so purchased during at least one-half of the two years he is required to remain in the Colony before the full title would be due to him; and that he has moreover effected substantial and useful improvements on the said land, to the value of at least ten shillings per acre.

A certificate of residence, and of the nature and value of the improvements effected on the land claimed, must be signed by the Resident Magistrate of the District in which the said land may be situated.

In case an Officer should die while holding a "location ticket" only, the land to which it refers will be transmitted in fee simple to his legal representative.
