IT is hereby notified, for general information, that His Excellency The Governor has received a Despatch from Her Majesty's Secretary of State for the Colonies informing him that Her Majesty will not be advised to exercise her power of disallowance with respect to the following Acts passed during the last Session of the Legislative Council of Western Australia:—

- No. 1.—“An Act further to amend the Law relating to the Administration of the Estates of deceased persons.”
- No. 3.—“An Act for appropriating certain Lands for the purpose of forming a new Street in the Town of Guildford.”
- No. 4.—“An Act to Naturalize Peter Ferrara.”
- No. 5.—“An Act to amend the Law of Evidence and Practice on Criminal Trials.”
